Editorial by James Read



Alistair Strathern MP's public discussion at Meppershall Village Hall, 10th May, saw the social club area completely full. People had plenty of concerns – about their individual situation in very challenging economic times, about how the government is trying to save money in ways that sometimes impact us and our families, about roads and schools and council services... and more! His visit was appreciated.

I took away several things. Someone commented that previous MPs hadn't done this kind of public meeting in the village. That really said something - everyone appreciated the time taken by our MP to come and chat. It was encouraging that the discussion was polite and respectful throughout, despite covering some tough topics and voicing different opinions and beliefs. There were questions about winter fuel allowance; support for families whose children have special needs (where hopefully our MP can assist the case individually); someone who didn't like VAT being added to their private school fees, plus a discussion of challenges in the mainstream school system (our area is stuck between a two-tier and three-tier system - Central Bedfordshire Council must get this sorted); and of course, the roads! Apparently CBC has the funds to make good the repairs that are now so urgently needed – but for various reasons it is not fulfilling its obligations; our MP expressed his commitment to achieve progress.

Local organisations can be more powerful than government in the quality of our community and lives, locally. They do so much to enhance life in Meppershall. A crucial part of how they work is their public meetings, to stay linked to what the community want (that means you!) Consider attending the Annual General Meeting of Meppershall Village Hall (p5) and the AGM of this very magazine (p6). Meppershall Parish Council (MPC) meetings are also open to the public (details are always available online at <https://meppershall-pc.gov.uk/parish-council/meetings/>).

We owe our community safety to all sorts of people. Local fire and rescue teams are some of the most important. The recent loss of two firefighters in Bicester near Oxford is a desperately sad reminder of their bravery and commitment. Our local service is looking for volunteers - on p7 you can see how you can consider getting involved.

But there are some things only each of us, individually, can do for the community and for ourselves. No sooner had I mentioned road safety in last month's editorial, than news of the death between Shillington and Stondon came through. What a tragedy, what a loss to family and friends. Please choose how you drive, to keep those around you very safe. Go slow, treat speed limits as the very maximum at which to drive.

The length and quality of our lives also depends on some things only we can manage – health choices that can make or break us. On p22 you will find some information on a new service supporting a public health initiative that could really change lives: maybe your life. Take a look and see if it could help you or someone you know.

Lastly, we sadly learned of Reverend John Harper's death in May. We hope to remember him more fully in a future issue, and for now we send deepest sympathies to Sandra and family as we remember the wonderful contribution he made to village life with gentle, loving leadership up to his retirement in 2011 that has been a key part of the church's success in Meppershall down the years. Rest in peace, John.

Not a letter, but an amazing phone conversation that we have been given kind permission to mention here...

“A Little Bit of History, May 2025 – 1 Rectory Road”

I was interested and amazed to see the photo of 1 Rectory Road in last month’s issue of The Meppershall Messenger. The photo shows my mother at the age of around 23, who was working and living in the house at that time, in service to Miss Nicholson and Miss Hilton. They were retired nurses who died in 1923 and 1926 and whose gravestone can still be found in the churchyard near the church door. Born in 1899, my mother, Ella Beerling, met George Jackson while she was living in service in Meppershall. Although she returned to Hitchin after her spell in Meppershall, she returned to marry George here at St Mary’s church. They initially rented a house not far from where she had worked, from Miss Long, who was originally connected to Stondon Manor. They went on to buy the house – which is still my home today.



What is this going to cost me in time?


We hope you are able to commit at least six hours a month. As a volunteer, you help when you are willing and able to, and volunteering times are by mutual agreement.



A Little Bit Of Natural History: Jeremy Holden

Last month we were back in May 1982 as Jeremy - then a boy but now a professional wildlife photographer who has specialised in the countries of South East Asia - was thrilled to have some close-up encounters with newly born owls (owlets).




But by the end of the year, he had mounted 19 home-made nesting boxes, each customised to be home to a specific type of bird. His scrapbook photos show how he and friend Stuart teetered on the top of a ladder to fix box number 11 – for a spotted flycatcher – high up on an ivy-clad elm tree. Boxes 12 and 13 were for great tits, one mounted on a field maple and another on a hawthorn. Box 15 (pictured here) aimed to attract robins. Jeremy knew it was already late in the spring nesting season, but he was keen to prepare for the following year and a new host of birdlife looking for homes in Meppershall.

Earlier in the year, blue tits had been the intended residents for Box 3. Now as May turned to June, the boys returned to check on progress and take care of the box if needed.

"We investigated to look at the eggs and see how they were getting on," he says in his notes. "On opening the lid we saw 10 pink blue tits in a small nest in the bottom of the box. Unlike the owls, they all hatch about the same time because the female does not start to incubate until all the eggs are laid. The 10 chicks grew surprisingly quickly and we were quite surprised to find later on that all 10 chicks were successfully reared and all of them left the box. Usually one or two eggs don't hatch and one or two of the chicks die in the box, for various reasons -

one being the cramped conditions and another the fierce competition for food that must go on."

But the boys also saw nests that didn't need a box. Wood pigeons remain one of the most common birds in parts of the village – and there were plenty to see in 1982, including a nest that Jeremy came across, photographed and wrote about. Made of large spindly twigs and



loosely mounted in low branches of a big bush, Jeremy noted, "The pigeon never lays more or less than two eggs and they sit on the frail nest like a pair of unseeing eyes."

But the owls continued to capture the boys' attention as the little owlets that they first spotted in May 1982 grew and were seen less often. Then one day they were back. "We saw the female owl sitting against the trunk of the copper Beech. Pressed against the trunk, she faces less danger of being discovered by the smaller birds that would mob her. We then saw the whole family - the male in the dead Beech, the female and the two young in the copper Beech."



"The two owlets were safely concealed among the copper Beech leaves. We looked hard but could not find the third chick. We were not too optimistic about its survival and it probably died because we did not see it again."

"It was mid June before I saw one of the owlets again. It had grown quite considerably also and could fly well. I managed one photograph before it flew away into the cover of a Yew Tree. The next time I saw one of them was on 25th June, when it was nearly fully grown."

Today, experts believe there are around 50,000 breeding pairs of tawny owls across the UK. To put that in perspective, that's a pair for every 1,000 people in the country, or perhaps one or two pairs in Meppershall (on average – although there are of course far more in rural places than in cities). In comparison, there are millions of blackbirds, pigeons and blue tits. So Jeremy and Stuart were lucky to have these wonderful experiences. You can see how it inspired a career in conservation. Perhaps the owls we hear hooting and screeching across the village on calm, quiet nights are the descendants of the very birds that were shown such kindness and consideration all those years ago. We will return to Jeremy's scrap book for a final time in the autumn.

June continues as another exciting month in the Church as we continue to retell the Gospel story and we celebrate Ascension Day, Pentecost, and then Trinity Sunday.

Ascension Day (this year 29th May) is celebrated 40 days after Easter - 40 days in which Jesus appeared to his followers on many occasions - until he returned to his Father's side: *"and then Jesus led his Disciples out to the vicinity of Bethany, he lifted up his hands and blessed them. While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up into heaven."* Luke 24:50-53.

Pentecost Sunday is 50 days after Easter and celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus... praying "Come Holy Spirit". It is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. 3,000 became believers that very day.

"...the sound of a mighty wind filled the house where believers were gathered, tongues of fire appeared and rested on each of them, and the believers were filled with the Holy Spirit..." Acts 2:2

Finally we celebrate Trinity Sunday - our Christian belief in One God - Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

After Trinity Sunday we enter Ordinary Time - or numbered weeks - as this year we continue to work our way through the Gospel of Luke.

Also in June is the Alban Pilgrimage when St Alban the first recorded British Christian Martyr is honoured in our Diocese. St Albans and the Abbey is always a lovely place to visit and so The Alban Pilgrimage might make a good day out /or part of a day out for some.

Every year, during the weekend closest to St Alban's feast day, St Albans Cathedral hosts the "Alban Pilgrimage" - this year actually on June 21st with events running from 11.00am - 5pm. Everyone is welcome to enjoy the procession of giant (12 foot) carnival puppets - Roman chariots, centurions, lions, roses and executioners that

move through the streets - while around 300 children, teenagers and adults from the local community retell the story of Alban's martyrdom.

In the afternoon the Alban Festival continues on the Orchard, High Street, and surrounding areas come alive with family activities, food and drink - in partnership with St Albans Business Improvement District.



This time of year is so busy in the garden. Lots of jobs to do - sowing seeds, planting perennials and annuals, watering and weeding. But what a lovely time of year it is - everything looking so lush and blooms and buds a-plenty! The warm weather has really helped everything along.

I love going into my garden and I'm sure things that weren't there the day before are blooming! I have a bistro set at the end of my garden where I draw my designs and get inspiration. I have designed it so I am immersed within the flower bed and plants are all around me, bees buzzing and birds singing. Bliss!

You can get so many different shades of sweetpeas although I think the pastel ones are my favourites. The scent is dreamy. There is a perennial variety but it has no scent and is very vigorous.

This year by chance I was moving around some things and put an obelisk in the middle of the bed to move it out of the way. When I looked, I thought it was the perfect place for my sweetpeas to climb up!

I chose the variety 'Primadonna' after a friend grew them for me last year. Another friend sent me a mammoth variety this year so I look forward to seeing these too! They know what I like!

I do love Sweetpeas. My sister had them as her wedding flowers and featured them on her wedding invites. They are so easy to grow and you can buy seed or plants for a couple of pounds which will give you endless bouquets of fragrant flowers. The more you pick, the more they keep giving. When they reach four leaves in growth, pinch them out so they bush out, become stronger and produce more flowers.

Train them up an obelisk and they will soon grow up it. Feed them once a week with a liquid fertiliser. A tip I learnt from my great uncle who was a

Sweetpeas were first recorded by a monk in Sicily in 1695 and there is an old fashioned variety named after him Cupani. By the 19th Century they were commercially bred and Henry Eckford, a Scottish nurseryman, crossbreed and developed the Grandiflora varieties with bigger blooms. They were very popular in Victorian times and were a sign of friendship.

There are now over 200 varieties, all of them gorgeous! So give them a go and you won't regret it!

Trugs And Trowels (Campton Gardening Club Newsletter) - June

Hi everyone, summer is in full swing and colour and beauty is in abundance.

A pot, good soil and a pinch of patience: whether a beginner or a seasoned grower your confidence and plate will be full in no time.

Short of space and want to grow your own food? You are in luck! With just a few pots, good soil and a sunny spot you'll be growing an abundance of veggies.

Here are twelve fast-growing veggies which grow in pots and you can harvest in a matter of weeks, grown from seed to table:

1. Radish - harvest in 3 to 4 weeks, sprinters in the veg world, from seed to plate in 21 days. Grow in 8" deep pot and harvest for green salads and sautés.
2. Lettuce - harvest in 4 to 6 weeks, grows quickly, you can harvest the outer leaves within a month and it will go on producing more.
3. Spinach - harvest in 4 to 5 weeks, not a fast grower, thrives in cool weather and you can start snipping baby leaves off to eat in just a few weeks.
4. Green onions (Scallions) - harvest in 3 to 4 weeks for instant gratification! Onions are your best friend, they grow quickly from seed, even faster from scraps, keep them watered and they will keep popping up.
5. Baby carrots - harvest in 5 to 6 weeks. With baby varieties, baby finger will mature in just over a month unlike full size carrots. Top tip - use deep pots 8" - 10" with loose, well-drained soil.
6. Arugula - harvest in 3 to 4 weeks, a container garden gem which germinates quickly, ready as baby greens to harvest in less than a month.
7. Peas - harvest in 6 to 7 weeks - climbing quickly, snap peas and snow peas grow fastest and like container life. A 10" - 12" deep pot and a small trellis or

a cage will do the trick.

8. Kale, a super food that grows well in pots and can be picked early or left to grow to full maturity.
9. Bok Choy - harvest in 4 to 5 weeks. This Asian green grows fast and tastes great in a stir fry, sautéed or even raw. Baby Bok Choy will mature quickly and fits well in smaller pots.
10. Beets - harvest in 6 weeks - leaves can be harvested in 4 weeks, but the bulbs take 6 weeks. Use deep pots 10" – 12," thin the seedlings to allow the bulbs to develop.
11. Mustard greens – a classroom classic, harvest in 4 to 5 weeks. Spicy, leafy and fast, a great addition to container garden. Water regularly, plant in a shallow wide container.
12. Turnips - harvest in 5 to 6 weeks (greens in 3 weeks). Just like beets, turnips offer quick greens and tasty roots. Baby turnips are tender and full of flavour and don't take up a lot of space.

Get the most return for your efforts!

Your pension and Inheritance tax (IHT)

Chancellor Rachel Reeves announced plans to include unused pension funds and death benefits within the value of estates for IHT purposes, during the Autumn Budget 2024. Under the proposals, pension administrators will report and pay IHT directly to HMRC. Death-in-service benefits paid out by employers have traditionally been separate from personal pensions for the purposes of calculating an IHT bill. By including unused pensions and death-in-service benefits in IHT calculations, more estates could face higher taxes.

This announcement came as a surprise, particularly to those who have worked hard to build a pension as a tax-efficient way to pass wealth on to loved ones. Any changes are likely to have the greatest impact on people with established estate plans.

Timeline - A 12-week technical consultation on the proposed changes concluded on 22 January. Once the feedback has been reviewed, government consultation principles outline that responses should be published within 12 weeks. By the third quarter of the year, the government is expected to provide specific implementation guidance on how pensions and death benefits will be treated under the new regime. Any changes won't take effect until 6 April 2027.

As proposals are not finalised, it's wise to consider potential implications but await the final guidance before overhauling plans. This still gives us ample time to make changes before implementation in 2027. A review of existing pension arrangements would be useful so we can think about how the proposed changes could affect what your beneficiaries would receive.


Meppershall Second Sunday Strollers

CBC, Bedford Borough and Milton Keynes are supported by a single Public Health team, which is supporting this new initiative. They want to help people across our area adopt healthier habits, improve their wellbeing, and achieve their goals to quit smoking or lose weight.

The rate of smoking nationally (England) was 11.6% in 2023 – so our area is a little better than the national average. Fewer people smoke in MK (7.6%).

In 2022-23, 64.0% of adults aged 18 years and over in England were estimated to be overweight or living with obesity, up from 61.2% in 2015-16. The CBC region is slightly above the national average at 67.5%, with MK and Bedford looking healthier at 63.2% and 62.1% respectively.

The smoking cessation programme offers face-to-face or virtual programme options. The healthy weight programme offers free 12-week group sessions, online or in person, with the goal of achieving a healthy weight.
