

Neighbourhood Safety - Can You Help?

Meppershall Speedwatch team needs volunteers to assist in running Speedwatch sessions within our village.

Speedwatch is designed to increase awareness of the necessity to obey speed limits within our village for the safety of pedestrians and other road users.

Using calibrated equipment supplied by Bedfordshire Police, the Speedwatch team



records motorists exceeding the speed limit. The record is then processed by Bedfordshire Police with a letter sent to the vehicle owner emphasising the safety aspects of obeying speed limits. Should the vehicle user be reported 3 times then it is possible that Bedfordshire Police will take further action.

Sessions are usually run weekday mornings or afternoons and last for no more than 1.5 hours, so if you have spare time and would like to help keep our village safe please contact us. Very little training/instruction is required and sessions can be arranged to suit members' commitments.







COVID Info: Have You Had the Jab?

Anyone over the age of 18 is now being invited to get their COVID-19 vaccine by calling 119, through local walk-in options (at https://bit.ly/2U4IYGT or through the National Booking Service: https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/coronavirus-vaccination/

It's the largest vaccination programme in the history of the NHS. The vaccine is being offered to more and more people in our area every week.

How do vaccines work?

Vaccines teach your immune system how to protect you from diseases. It's much safer for your immune system to learn this through vaccination than by catching the diseases and attempting to fight them.

Can I catch Covid-19 from the vaccine?

No. You cannot catch Covid-19 from taking the vaccine but having the vaccine could stop you from becoming seriously ill if you catch the infection.

Should I be concerned about the speed the vaccine was made available?

The speed in which the vaccines have been developed does not mean that they are unsafe. The technology used to develop the vaccine is not new. It's been tried and tested for decades. It is with this technology and massive global investment to develop a Covid-19 vaccine that has allowed it to be available so quickly.

Any coronavirus vaccine that is approved must go through lots of clinical trials and safety checks, like all other licensed medicines, before it is approved. The Covid-19 vaccines used in the UK have been declared as effective by the UK's independent Medicines and Healthcare Products Regulator (MHRA) after extensive trials. What about getting a Covid-19 test?

Find information about using the simple rapid lateral flow self-test conveniently in your own home at https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests or by calling 119. Around 1 in 3 people with COVID-19 do not have symptoms. Rapid lateral flow tests help to find cases in people who may have no symptoms but are still infectious and can give the virus to others. The test usually involves taking a sample from your tonsils (or where they would have been) and from your nose, using a swab. You can get a result in 30 minutes. Please consider testing if you are going to be with other people, whether or not you have been vaccinated.

Meppershall Parish Council: Meeting on Monday 14th June.

Public Session – CBC Ward Councillor Mark Liddiard provided an update on Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) activities as follows:

- The Library in Shefford is fully open from Tuesday 15th June.
- Chapel Road marked out for patching works. Due to the extent of patching required he will contact Highways to suggest re-surfacing of the road.
- Chapel Road has had monitoring traffic flow tubes installed (number of vehicles passing and at what speeds). Results pending
- CBC received £225k in Welcome Back funding from the Government to be spread across all towns and parishes e.g.: Shefford received £6k to organise markets.
- CBC received £332k from the Government's Safer Street fund that will go towards CCTV, street lighting, parking areas, video doorbells, asset marking systems in areas of crime etc.
- East West Rail Consultation CBC are keen that parish councils respond. Their two focus area are:
 - 3000 new homes to be built near Marston Vale therefore a Rail bypass needed around Liddlington.
 - Tempsford is a future strategic site and CBC would support a line south of St. Neots.

Questions / Comments from the public

- An allotment tenant requested that the Clerk investigate plots that have become overgrown. The Clerk advised of an imminent allotment inspection.
- Flooding outside 55A to 55C High Street. Water is pooling despite a drain being installed. It was requested that photos of the pooling water and additional details be added to CBC's Fix My Street.

- The Chairman advised that he has received a letter from a resident regarding Old Road Meadow and asking:
 - Are the goal posts staying? *The Clerk advised that they would as they were well used.*
 - O Can saplings be transposed to other areas and can oak saplings be planted in the nature reserve? Councillors agreed that an Environment and Leisure working group meeting should be held to discuss issues raised and that the resident be asked to join the meeting.

Clerk's Report and Matters Arising

- CBC road closure 9393 of Shefford Road from the junction of Emery Croft to the roundabout. Start date 26th July End Date 3rd September.
- CBC road closure 9290 of Shefford Road from 19th to 21st July. Ward Cllr Liddiard will investigate if this closure can be carried out at the same time as CBC 9393.

Procedures, Consultations & Legal

An expression of interest in co-option was received from Mr Peter Crossley who had served as a councillor for Meppershall previously. Council resolved to co-opt Mr Crossley onto the MPC and it was agreed that Cllr Crossley would join the Planning Working Group.

MPC Social Media Policy v1.1 was adopted by Council.

Council approved the launch of a new website on www.meppershall.org and the addition of a 'Website Directory' titled 'Supporting Meppershall Organisations - Keeping it local' listing Meppershall organisations. Where possible links to the organisations' website and contact details will be provided. All local organisations will be able to submit an application for inclusion in the directory on the new website.

Council resolved to support both Gravenhurst Neighbourhood Plan and Campton & Chicksands Neighbourhood Plan - Submission Consultation (Regulation 16).

Centenary Field Parish Facilities – The Clerk updated Council on the handover of Centenary Field. A letter from Croudace was received on 27th May with a draft Settlement Agreement. The working group amended the Settlement Agreement as Croudace want it to be a full and final settlement of any future claims that may arise. As Meppershall Village Hall was designed and constructed by Croudace, we have no way of knowing whether there may be any fundamental structural issues that may arise in the future. MVHT and MPC are happy to confirm that we are not currently aware of any such potential claims. The working group have included a mutual obligation for Croudace to progress the transfer without delay. On 7th June Croudace responded saying that the settlement sums offered were on the basis that this is a final settlement for all matters and have referred MVHT to consider the provisions made in the original contract. Croudace cannot accept a settlement that implies in some way that, notwithstanding the contractual position, there continues

to be contractual liability for them. On 8th June, solicitors representing MPC and MVHT were asked to review the draft settlement agreement and consider/advise as to the appropriate amendments required to safeguard MVHT's and MPC's positions.

Stocken House Green Open Space – The Clerk reported that Davidsons Homes have forwarded a draft management agreement, transfer and other documents concerning the open green space. A detailed review of the management agreement is required to ensure that MPC understand the implications of the handover, in particular any ongoing post-handover obligations which seem to be wrapped up in CBC planning consent. In the event that MPC proceed with handover MPC will need to provide Davidsons with the details of a solicitor acting on our behalf. It was proposed to use solicitors currently dealing with the Croudace handover. The Clerk will contact CBC for assistance in understanding obligations of the planning permission granted. Documentation and findings with proposals to be presented to MPC at the next meeting.

Finance – Council reviewed and approved income, expenditure, purchase orders, journal entries, bank reconciliations, bank statements and authorised a schedule of payments.

Planning and Housing - MPC considered planning applications relevant to Meppershall as follows:

- i. CB/21/02080/LB Fowlers Farm, 28 High Street Variation of the design to the garage *No Objections*
- ii. CB/21/01596/FULL 40 Fildyke Road Front porch, rear loft conversion and rear conservatory conversion *No Objections*
- iii. CB/21/02290/FULL 113 High Street Single storey front, side and rear extensions, part two storey rear extension, loft extension and conversion No Objections
- iv. CB/21/02334/VOC 84 Fildyke Road, SG17 5LU Variation (or removal) of condition numbers 17 of planning permission CB/20/03505/VOC - No Objections
- v. Council endorsed Gravenhurst Parish Council objection to planning application CB/21/02011/OUT Greenwoods, Land North of Higham Road and East of the A6 Bedford Road, Barton Le Clay 3850 new dwellings and associated development, and will submit its own objection letter.

MPC 'capital projects' – Councillors requested that the Clerk add to the MPC 'capital projects' list the following:

- Vehicle Activated Signs
- Footpath to Shefford
- MPC Cemetery planning and set up

Neighbourhood Plan – The Clerk reported that a meeting was held on 27th May to carry out the Neighbourhood Plan (NP) handover. Items covered included; the end of grant report, new grant application, draft NP and consultation document. End of grant report submitted on 1st June. New grant submission to be made by the Clerk

when quotations received for inclusion. Advice sought from consultant regarding Regulation 14 consultation. The Chairman advised of an offer to assist with Regulation 14 feedback from Mrs A Lester.

Highways and Transport – Cllr Seaman thanked Cllrs Brown, Liddiard and Morgan for assisting with the village walk about. He brought to the attention of council that the s278 agreement as part of the 15 Shillington Road development has still not been completed. It is 6 months since presentation of the highways petition to CBC at the Traffic Management Meeting when CBC Ward Councillor and Portfolio Holder Cllr Dalgarno called for a holistic approach, which now seemingly means that Meppershall residents may have to wait 2-3 years for any major road improvements such as road re-surfacing, chicanes, crossings etc. as improvements will not take place until all speed measurement readings are taken and major housebuilding developments are completed. The proposed reduction to 40mph on the A507 was still awaiting a response from Beds Police.

Environment and Leisure (Centenary Field Parish Facilities) - The Clerk reported:

- The installation of a wooden gate and kissing gate on the Crackle Hill track is pending handover.
- The Clerk and Cllr Thompson meet with AA Sherriffs to discuss planned works on Monday 24th May. Sherriffs will be sending over revised quotations with start dates for work and will arrange to dig test pits to ensure nothing untoward is buried beneath the Centenary Field grass.
- Pitch and field grass cutting organised.

Health & Safety and Risk Management (Community Safety) – The Clerk reported that subsequent to a meeting with Beds Police and CBC Community Safety Officers on 21st April:

- Combatting ASB Storage containers to be painted so that youths cannot climb up. Items under the tarpaulin and bench to be removed. Benches have been secured to the ground
- Speeding PCSO Lee et al to carry out speed enforcement work on Shefford Road. Cllr Seaman raised this issue with the new PCC on 7th June.
- Dog Fouling Clerk has provided CBC with list of hotspot areas so that they can be added to the patrol list.
- Youth Activities Grand Union Housing Group (GUHG) are looking at the youth activities they are able to offer Meppershall over the summer and beyond. The Clerk has suggested that they link up with CBC Youth Engagement Teams to offer a Youth Club in the village. If you think you could help set up a Youth Club in the village, please contact the Clerk at: clerk@meppershall.org.
- Community Safety Group CBC Safer Communities Officers to contact the Clerk to assist in setting up.

The next meeting of Meppershall Parish Council will take place on Monday 12th July 2021 at Meppershall Village Hall at 7.45pm.

Meppershall Parish Council: Focus on Planning and Housing Working Group

Members are: The Clerk, Cllrs Chapman, Crossley and Thompson

Role of the working group and MPC in planning applications

After a planning application is accepted by CBC, statutory consultees and affected residents are notified. At this point the Clerk forwards the application details to councillors with information on the deadline date for a response and the MPC meeting date at which the application will be discussed. The Planning and Housing working group will review the application documents and details and make recommendations to Council at the next meeting. MPC are always pleased to receive constructive feedback from residents on planning applications either via email before, or during monthly parish council meetings for consideration. Once MPC agree whether to comment on, object to, or support a planning application, a formal written response is made.

Although MPC is a statutory consultee for planning applications submitted within the parish, MPC is not a Planning Authority and as such it has no statutory powers to reject planning applications, nor to impose conditions on planning applications that are approved.

Avoid wasting time

Let's be honest, when submitting objections, only certain issues (known as material planning considerations) will be taken into account in deciding the planning application. These include the following (not an exhaustive list):

- 1. Local, strategic and national planning policies, plus emerging new plans that have been through at least one stage of consultation
- 2. Previous planning and appeal decisions, plus principles of case law held through the courts
- 3. Overshadowing and loss of light based on Building Research Establishment guidance
- 4. Overlooking and loss of privacy
- 5. Highway issues, including traffic generation, vehicular access and highway safety
- 6. Noise and disturbance from proposed use, including operating hours
- 7. Smells and fumes
- 8. Storage and handling of hazardous materials
- 9. Effect on listed buildings, conservation areas, scheduled monuments and archaeology
- 10. Loss or effect on trees
- 11. Adverse impacts on nature conservation interests and biodiversity
- 12. Layout and density of building design, visual appearance and finishing materials
- 13. Landscaping and means of enclosure

Issues that <u>are not</u> relevant to the decision-making process and cannot be taken into account include the following (*not an exhaustive list*):

- loss of view
- negative impact on property value
- land and boundary disputes between neighbours and/or damage to property
- private rights of access and covenants
- the impact of construction work
- opposition to business competition
- personal morals or views about the applicant
- opposition to the principle of development if this has been decided by an outline planning permission or appeal decision.
- matters controlled under other non-planning legislation, for example, building regulations

Make your voice heard

The easiest way to find and comment on planning applications is on CBC's planning portal

(http://plantech.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/PLANTECH/DCWebPages/AcolNetCGI.gov)

You can often see details of planning applications attached to lamp posts, or telegraph poles close to the property with the application. In addition to providing your feedback on CBC's website you can also write to them or send them an email.

Remember, CBC will not record or consider comments that are made verbally, made in person, made by telephone, posted on social media pages (including CBC's own pages) or that contain offensive, defamatory or discriminatory language.

MPC will often call upon the support of the whole village in its objections to planning applications. It provides help with wording to be used by individuals in objecting to planning applications on its website www.meppershall.org and on its Facebook page: https://www.facebook.com/MeppershallParishCouncil/ so please look out for these and get involved.

In order to refuse a planning application, the CBC Planning Officer must:

- Identify the specific problem (it must be a relevant material planning consideration)
- Identify the harm that it would cause to the public interest
- Set the objection in a policy context





What is a councillor?

Councillors are elected to represent an individual geographical ward or parish, in Meppershall it is the entire parish. They are generally elected by the public every four years, but there are Co-option spaces available on the Parish Council at the moment as Councillors Karslake, Austin and Thomason have given their resignations to the Parish Council.

What do councillors do?

Councillors have three main components to their work:

- Decision making Through meetings and attending committees with other elected members, councillors decide which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies should be implemented.
- 2. Monitoring Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well things are working.
- 3. Getting involved locally As local representatives, councillors have responsibilities towards their constituents and local organisations. These responsibilities and duties often depend on what the councillor wants to achieve and how much time is available, and may include:
 - Going to meetings of local organisations such as the Beds Police Priority Setting Meetings
 - Reviewing planning applications
 - Participating in litter picks
 - o Taking up issues on behalf of members of the public

How much time does it take up?

Quite often councillors say that their duties occupy them for about an hour a week. Obviously, there are some councillors who spend more time than this - and some less, but in the main, being a parish councillor is an enjoyable way of contributing to village life, and helping to make it a better place to live and work.

As a councillor representing the parish you will help keep it a great place to live and work. You will be supported in your role and will be expected to undertake training. You should be comfortable working electronically. You should have a positive outlook and a can-do attitude and be willing to work as part of a team.

Retirement Planning



- the dissolution of the four benefices of Campton, Clophill and Haynes; Maulden; Clifton and Southill; and Meppershall and Shefford;
- the creation of three new benefices of (i) Campton, Meppershall and Shefford;
 (ii) Clophill and Maulden; and (iii) Clifton, Haynes and Southill, for the appointment of their first incumbents and their places of residence, and for the future patronage arrangements for each new benefice; and
- the transfer of the parsonage house of the benefice of Campton, Clophill and Haynes to the Saint Albans Diocesan Board of Finance for diocesan purposes

A notice giving the objects of proposed pastoral reorganisation affecting this parish has or will be displayed near the main door of the Church and is available on the Church of England website www.churchofengland.org/consultation

All Pastoral Schemes follow the Diocesan Principles of Pastoral Reorganisation agreed in 2018. These are publicly available on our website: www.stalbans.anglican.org/wp-content/uploads/Pastoral-re-organisation-principles-2018.pdf

If they receive representations against the draft Scheme, the Church Commissioners will send all representations, both for and against, to the Bishop whose views will be sought. Individual representors will then receive copies of the Commissioners' correspondence with the Bishop (including copies of all the representations) and they may comment further in writing to the Commissioners in light of the diocesan response if they so wish.

If there are no representations against the draft Scheme, the Commissioners will make the Scheme and arrange for it to be brought into effect.





As you can see by the cast list even back then we had more parts than people with young John Handscombe (16 at the time) playing two roles. I remember experiencing a certain sense of dejá vu, as I had stood on the same stage twice before in panto (when Meppershall Primary School was raising money for a swimming pool, I was the front of a rickshaw in Aladdin in 1969 age 7, then in the chorus in Mother Goose in 1970, aged 8).

We did four performances, Thursday, Friday and Saturday evenings and Saturday afternoon. All performances were very well attended and very well received. I can still remember Mick in a big, grey wolf costume, singing 'Temptation' (Bing Crosby sings it almost as well on You Tube but without the furry costume).

I remember the whole cast and crew pitching in with set painting. I remember painting a door with Irene Fox (doing props with Jessie Niven). The door was for the Grandma's Cottage scene. It was brown before we started and Irene envisaged it being grey with four inset panels. As I'd never done set painting before (neither had

Irene) I thought "That sounds good" and so we set about our task. When finished, we stood back admiring our handy work. Betty Blenkinsopp (Publicity) who knew how to paint and build sets said, "That looks good, what scene is it for?" Irene replied, "The cottage".... "That needs to be brown" said Betty, "As it's a door you'd have on a forest cottage". So we painted it back to brown and laughed when we realised we could have left it as was and just painted black lines to make it look log cabin-ish!

The other thing that made me laugh with that door, as it stood central at the back of the stage, it was supposed to be self-standing but always went to tip over when the door was opened and the frame had to be held either side. The amount of paint it had on it, the door should have stood up on its own.

Little Red Riding Hood was so well received that pantomime became a mainstay of the Meppershall Players' repertoire (in the early 2000's, doing nine performances each year). 1985 would bring another part of the Players' repertoire, but we'll save that for next month's issue.

Diary of an allotment

After the late start things are now catching up on the allotment. Conversation has turned to how the late start has thrown us off our routines and it is difficult to reset. Each year on the allotment is different and you have to be responsive to the weather conditions. June has not been as warm as we would like it and it has also set things back. The upside has been that watering has been easier as the ground has stayed wet.

It doesn't look like last year's courgette disaster will be repeated as the plants are growing well. I was recently watching a clip of Call the Midwife when courgettes from an allotment were seen as a new exotic vegetable from France. It is hard to imagine a time before the allotment tradition of the great annual courgette glut. It goes to show how much richer we are in so many ways when we exchange ideas and are open to trying new things.

The strawberry crop has been exceptionally good and we have had enough to make strawberry mousse which was a bit of a winner around here. My botched attempts at dessert are legendary in our family. My children tell the story when I announced I would do banana splits for pudding but we only had bananas and none of the other ingredients which make the split worth having. So I cut the bananas in half and presented them in an emperor's new clothes style (needless to say it didn't fool anyone!).

The next two months are very much about picking and eating all the produce with ony the watering to be getting on with.

We have just one aim for July and that is to get on top of the weeds. It has been a busy couple of months and we haven't spend as much time on the allotment as we would like so we need to concentrate on things we can do to finish the season strongly. There is still time for cut and come again lettuce, peas and late season carrots.

It is also a good time to turn your mind to whether you will be planting autumn onions. I tried them last year for the first time and I had limited success. I shall have another go this year and try to water them more to see if that helps. It is all a learning process and I would like to crack the winter onion growing as they produce a crop sooner than the spring set ones.

For anyone wishing to take on an allotment in the summer a start can be made by clearing it so you are ready for a flying start in the spring. You could still get brassicas in if you buy garden centre plants. Purple sprouting broccoli being an easy thing to grow and one of the first crops I tried. In the spring it lifts your spirits when the forgotten corner of the allotment produces a vegetable that looks better than the supermarket bought one.

Bedford Model Engineering Society - Summerfield Miniature Railway

We Are Open Again – here are some updates on 2021 events.

With Covid-19 Secure Running at least until June 26th.

Bedford Model Engineering Society is once again able to open its railway to the public - but for the time being we will have to operate in the same way as we did during 2020 (see the service description that follows). We hope to resume "normal" public running towards the end of June but that will depend upon the further relaxation or removal of the Covid restrictions.

With the current concerns regarding the "Indian Variant", particularly as it affects the Bedford area, and the subsequent uncertainty that "Step 4" will happen on June 21st, we have decided to add Sunday June 27th to the booking calendar. By so doing we should still be able to open for those who have booked should Step 4 not happen. If in the end, Covid restrictions are removed before the 27th we can still decide to revert to pre-Covid operating when booking was not required.

"Covid" regulated service - there is a lot to tell you here, but please read through to the end.

Unfortunately, we are not still going to be able to operate <u>all</u> of our railways with the Covid regulations as they currently are. So, we will continue as last year with the "new" ride combining the Summerfields Line (the 'main line') from Haynes End with the Springfield Line at Hammer Hill. This gives a journey time nearly twice that of the old main line run. The trains will not be stopping at Hammer Hill.

Trains will have only one carriage and the passengers on each train must all be from the same household or "Bubble". .

Our Buffet will open as a take-away service with tea, coffee, soft drinks and packaged snack items. Our picnic tables will be available outside - suitably distanced!

Toilets - as you may know the toilets do not belong to Bedford MES but are provided as a communal facility by our landlord for those on the Summerfields Barns site. Although they are not our responsibility, we will endeavour to check them on a regular basis. We will be providing hand sanitiser in a dispenser just outside the toilet block.

In common with other visitor attractions we have had to move to booking in advance in order to better manage passenger numbers on our site, and **all** payments will have to be made using contactless card.

We use your details to process your booking but we are also required to take contact details of visitors for Track and Trace purposes. No data will be retained beyond one month after your visit and will not be used for purposes other than those stated.

Therefore, we are asking that everybody who wants to ride our trains, first makes a booking online. Payment will still be taken at our Ticket Office but, again as other venues, **only** by contactless card.

Our trains will carry a maximum of six passengers with a maximum of four adults. Please do not attempt to book more than this on one train.

A round trip ticket will cost £4 **per person**. Children under the age of two still travel free. We hope that you will understand that the price increase this year was unavoidable. We have not increased prices for several years, and it was set to happen last year, but we deferred that increase. However, with our receipts last year only around 50% of the previous year a price rise this year was necessary if the railway was to survive for you to enjoy.

So, please pick a time and date on the booking form at the bottom of this page, complete with your details and submit. You will receive a confirmation email by return.

Please ensure that you bring the confirmation email with you on the day as it is your E-ticket.

In the event that you have to CANCEL we would **really** like you to let us know (before your day of travel if at all possible, please), by clicking the REPLY button to the confirmation email and dropping us a one-liner.

Since we started this new way of working we have always been fully booked. However we have found that between 15% and 20% of the folk who have booked simply do not bother to show up, thus denying others the chance for a ride (and us some much needed funds).

We would rather not take payment at the time of booking but what we will do is reserve the right to offer the slot to anyone wanting another ride if you are not checked in at the car park entrance a minimum of TEN minutes <u>before</u> your train departure time. Please, please make sure that you are checked in with our car park staff at least ten minutes before your train is due to depart – if you are later than that, we will not be able to guarantee your ride.

And lastly, it is a *railway* so, just like the "big" trains, departure times may slip a bit from your booked time due to operational circumstances. We will do our very best to be on schedule, but please be patient with us if we should be running late!

Thank You for your understanding and for supporting our railway - as always, we are looking forward to seeing you.


