## **Editorial by Mick Ridley and James Read**

Tucked away in a corner of the magazine this month is a summary of the work going on to build "The Meppershall Pipeline". No... don't worry... nobody has struck oil in the village! And (sadly) it is not a secret supply from Gazprom to take the pressure off our gas



prices. It is an important part of our future water infrastructure (and a very interesting project from a technical point of view... showing my geeky side there!) But it also poses a risk to wildlife, habitats, scenery and farming and we will all want to see it done well by Anglian Water within the commitments they appear to be making as part of the planning process. It will certainly be a source of interest during the winter months. Our particular thoughts are with the farmers whose land will be disrupted by the project for some months to come.

We thank the Meppershall Village Hall (MVH) Committee for their response to letters and articles in last month's issue which were voicing increasing concern at the direction being taken by the Village Hall. All eyes on the Annual General Meeting of the Village Hall, scheduled for 5<sup>th</sup> December at 6pm (in the Village Hall, we assume! More info from <a href="mailto:trustees@meppershallvillagehall.co.uk">trustees@meppershallvillagehall.co.uk</a>). We believe anyone can attend and observe the AGM but the MVH Committee will need to confirm how contributions and comments can be expressed and what the agenda will be.

"There would undoubtedly be some debate about the criteria to be applied if different prices for those based outside the Parish were to be considered." So says MVH; and yes, some debate is certain, and we are happy to kick it off to help find a solution...!

MVH is founded legally and financially on philanthropy – related to its not-for-profit role as a key facility for our village. The criteria referred to above could be relatively simple. A concessionary (reduced rate) pricing scheme could apply to organisations whose leadership and/or membership is predominantly resident in the Parish – with provisos. The 'normal' tariff would be applied to private parties and events; and to bookings from which an income, profit or fundraising will be gained by an individual or organisation/company – whether or not they are resident in the village. In the end, MVH would have the right to exercise its discretion, but 'borderline' examples under these kinds of criteria are no reason not to get this sorted.

Of course, we are lucky to have problems like this to think about in the village. We are fortunate to be part of a thriving community – strolling to the new Budgens as pictured on our cover, picking up goodies from Roger's Bakery, having a quick half at the Sugar Loaf or Social Club or just wandering on a beautiful footpath nearby. Life is too short. November brings our Remembrance of those who saved our nation to be what it is today – with all of its imperfections, challenges and uncertainties. On Remembrance Sunday at 10.45am at church, we stand and we gather to think of the young people lost to the village in two World Wars. And we remember also those who served since, some of whom also lost their lives in service to the nation. They shall not grow old, as we that are left grow old. Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn. At the going down of the sun, and in the morning, we will remember them.






Our **November coffee morning** will have a **Remembrance theme**, so please bring along

## COVID Info: Have You Had the Jab?

Anyone over the age of 18 is now being invited to get their COVID-19 vaccine by calling 119, through local walk-in options (at <a href="https://bit.ly/2U4IYGT">https://bit.ly/2U4IYGT</a> or through the National Booking Service: <a href="https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/coronavirus-vaccination/">https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/coronavirus-vaccination/</a>

It's the largest vaccination programme in the history of the NHS. The vaccine is being offered to more and more people in our area every week.

## How do vaccines work?

Vaccines teach your immune system how to protect you from diseases. It's much safer for your immune system to learn this through vaccination than by catching the diseases and attempting to fight them.

## Can I catch Covid-19 from the vaccine?

No. You cannot catch Covid-19 from taking the vaccine but having the vaccine could stop you from becoming seriously ill if you catch the infection.

## Should I be concerned about the speed the vaccine was made available?

The speed in which the vaccines have been developed does not mean that they are unsafe. The technology used to develop the vaccine is not new. It's been tried and tested for decades. It is with this technology and massive global investment to develop a Covid-19 vaccine that has allowed it to be available so quickly.

Any coronavirus vaccine that is approved must go through lots of clinical trials and safety checks, like all other licensed medicines, before it is approved. The Covid-19 vaccines used in the UK have been declared as effective by the UK's independent Medicines and Healthcare Products Regulator (MHRA) after extensive trials. ## What about getting a Covid-19 test?

Find information about using the simple rapid lateral flow self-test conveniently in your own home at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests or by calling 119">https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests or by calling 119</a>. Around 1 in 3 people with COVID-19 do not have symptoms. Rapid lateral flow tests help to find cases in people who may have no symptoms but are still infectious and can give the virus to others. The test usually involves taking a sample from your tonsils (or where they would have been) and from your nose, using a swab. You can get a result in 30 minutes. Please consider testing if you are going to be with other people, whether or not you have been vaccinated.







# Meppershall Parish Council: Environment and Leisure Working Group Members

## Role of the working group:

The focus of the Environment and Leisure Working Group is perhaps the widest of all our working groups as they currently cover amongst other things:

- Provision of allotments at Wry Close
- Maintenance of Old Road Meadow Nature Reserve and all other green open spaces owned by the Council
- Equipping of Council maintained play areas
- Assisting in monitoring grass cutting within the village
- Implementation of actions from the Village Green Infrastructure Plan

We hope to add to this list with the promotion of the the use of the sports pitch and outdoor gym on Centenary Field, the set up of the Parish Cemetery and the maintenance of the 5-acre green open space on the new Stocken House development site (more on this at a later date).

The Working Group covers all this, without mentioning organising and participating in litter picks, checking on council-owned benches, planting new shrubs and trees.... the list goes on.

Currently the group is working on some exciting projects that will see enhancements to the allotments, the re-development of the play area at Old Road Meadow, planting of semi -mature trees in Old Road Meadow Nature Reserve and the commissioning of 'Elizabeth and Phillip' trees and benches to celebrate the Queens Platinum Jubilee next year. Works to improve Centenary Field post-handover (installation of drainage, landscaping, new outdoor gym and new play equipment) will also be managed by the Working Group.

Obviously, the 4 members of the Working Group can't manage all this work on their own. Often, we rely upon the services of specialist contractors and a number of residents with exceptional knowledge to help guide our decision making or implement plans. If you have an interest in different aspects of work covered by the Working Group and are willing to give us some of your time, why not volunteer to help us? Just email the clerk (clerk@meppershall.org).


## M1 – A6 Link Road Gets Funding

You may remember our article in last month's village magazine where we looked at the major regional development initiative known as the Oxford to Cambridge Arc. You may be asking yourself what that has to do with the M1-A6 Link Road, for which CBC was recently awarded almost £33 Million by Central Government. The answer was recently given by the Chief Exec of the South East Midlands Local Enterprise Partnership (SEMLEP) who said "This major infrastructure project will facilitate economic growth in Central Bedfordshire and improve east-west connectivity within the south east midlands and wider Oxford to Cambridge Arc."

## What is this road all about?

The road aims to open up new land for business, warehouses and factories, as well as new homes as well as relieving congestion locally on smaller roads between Luton, Houghton Regis and smaller villages such as Sundon and Streatley.

The project to build the road is led by SEMLEP and CBC and supported by the Department for Transport. CBC Leader Richard Wenham commented that the new road is all about "improved east west connectivity across *Central Bedfordshire and the wider area*" - bringing with it 3,600 new homes as part of CBC's Local Plan as well as a rail freight interchange.



## What exactly will the road be like?

It will be 2.75 miles long, running from Junction 11a on the M1 to a new junction on the A6 just south of Streatley. With a 50mph speed limit all the way, it also includes a new three-metre-wide foot and cycle path on its south side. CBC have committed to link the new cycle route to National Cycleway Network Route 6 – making it part of a growing cycle infrastructure in our region, with an ambition to link Luton and Bedford. A number of walking routes will sadly be cut off by the new road, unless bridges or crossing points are part of the construction... for now such crossings are only called "opportunities."

## Why should we care here in Meppershall?

The new road is not that far away. If it is intended to contribute to east-west travel in the Oxford-Cambridge Arc, we have to ask ourselves what is the next instalment of the route? The illustration above is a reminder that we sit in a vale of villages that stretches all the way to Cambridge through some of England's most beautiful and precious countryside. What's clear is that the villages of Lilley, Hexton, Pegsdon, Shillington, Pirton as well as Meppershall and others beyond will all expect some protection. The Chilterns Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, and the increasingly recognised "Greensand Country" provide that protection (to a degree) to the south and north. But Meppershall, like the soon to be redeveloped RAF Henlow and many other ancient, beautiful and very sustainable villages, lies in between. It is only natural to wonder, what comes next?

# TAKEARINE ON THE WWANDERBUS

# Welcome to our feature where John, the editor of LivingLife Magazine catches the Wanderbus!

#### THE ROUTE

I decided to catch the W3S service to Biggleswade. The W3S picks up at various bus stops in Stotfold, including the A507/Hitchin Road, Regent Street, The Green and then also in Astwick. The W3S then heads up the A1 and drops off at the A1 Retail Park, the town centre (bus station), Asda, and finally Sainsbury's at the north end of town.

#### THE JOURNEY

I jumped on the bus at Regent Street, which arrived on time at 9.46am. I paid my fare and took my ticket, but please note, if you are entitled to a bus pass then your journey is free of charge. This makes Wanderbus a fantastic way for retired people to travel to a whole host of destinations.

Our friendly driver, called Geoff, was very helpful assisting elderly passengers with their bags and walking aids. Sitting at the back of the bus (of course), I got chatting to Barry (Geoff's mate) and Budgie, both regulars on this service. It was interesting to discover that pre-Covid, two buses were required to fulfil demand for the Biggleswade service, it is hoped that demand will return once again. Our main conversation was about the levels of new-build housing developments popping up not only in Stotfold and Biggleswade but across all of Central Beds. An impassioned conversation ensued, and I am sure we could have discussed the topic for hours.



#### THE DESTINATION

Biggleswade has lots to see and do and has a thriving town centre, and on a lovely sunny day it was a pleasure to visit. With a host of cafes, coffee shops, pubs, and independent shops, there's lots to see and do. I headed over to the Surfin Café, in the Market Square, and treated myself to a delicious coffee and cake, sat in the outside seating area, watching the world pass by.

Next, I popped into a wonderful DIY / Hardware store called JR Goldthorpe & Son. A delightful store with so much variety for a small shop, If you ever need those odd bits-n-bobs, you'll almost certainly find it quicker and easier than endlessly clicking around online or trawling through a huge DIY store.

It is well worth a visit to the Church of St. Andrew, its grounds are peaceful and tranquil, and from here it is a short walk to Mill Lane where you can access the Kingfisher Way which runs along the River Ivel. It's worth noting that it is only a short walk (1.25miles) to get to Jordan's Mill where you can dine at the riverside café and explore the gardens.

Many passengers alighted at the A1 Retail Park, which is perfect if you fancy some retail therapy with a host of big-name stores including M&S, Next, Boots, H&M and TK Maxx plus many more. ## **Anglian Water - The Meppershall Pipeline**

You may have spotted groundworks happening on the fields between Meppershall and Gravenhurst and just west of Shillington Road on the way out of the village down to Shillington. The works are part of an Anglian Water project known as "The Meppershall Pipeline". Here is a quick review of the project and some info on how Anglian Water will adopt techniques that aim to minimise environmental and habitat losses.

Anglian Water is facing several long term challenges. Our region (East of England) is officially under "severe water stress," with lower than average rainfall and additional negative impacts of climate change (getting hotter and drier). At the same time the regional population is set to grow by 20% over the next 25 years (it feels like more than that in Meppershall), but drought conditions have arisen at times and Anglian Water is also working on its drought resilience.

Alongside these issues, a growing focus on the damage being done to the environment by water extraction means Anglian Water is working to reduce the amount of water it takes from the environment.

So they are building 500km of new pipelines which are interconnected to move water around the region. This means redistributing from areas where there is a surplus (such as North Lincolnshire) and giving more homes and businesses a supply that is based on more than one water source. That's where the Meppershall Pipeline comes in.

The Meppershall Pipeline forms part of the wider network that is being created. It is 9 KM in length, starting in Meppershall at Shillington Road water facility and running to the pumping station on New Road between Ampthill and Flitton.

The pipeline route runs down from behind Windmill Farm just south of Meppershall to cross the River Hit north of the cow bridge, rising back up to cross Campton Road just outside Upper Gravenhurst. From there its route continues right past Cainhoe Manor Farm, along the northern edge of Wrest Park. It crosses the A6 just north of Silsoe and crosses the A507 between Hollington Farm and Brookside Farm in Maulden.

The construction phase will involve creating a series of secure working spaces and storage locations along the length of route. These will include a site on Shillington Road at the edge of our village, and another on Campton Road in Gravenhurst. Just beyond Upper Gravenhurst, another three sites are planned around Clophill Road, two on the track to Cainhoe Park Farm and another beside Cainhoe Manor Farm.

Anglian Water says much of the pipelaying will be done using a "Pipe Plough." This is a remotely controlled machine that follows a set GPS route. It prepares a narrow section underground, lays the pipe in it and restores the ground behind – all at once, avoiding major excavation. A second technique – "Trenchless" – will be used at sensitive ecological sites, roads and rivers. In this case a pit is dug out on either side of the obstacle, a hole is bored underground and the pipe is dragged through. Lastly, where necessary, open cut trenches will be dug out into which the pipe will be laid. We all hope that is a last resort since that technique will destroy field margins, hedgerows and woodland – crucial wildlife habitats in this rural area.

Timelines published in June indicate construction between the end of 2021 and the middle of 2022 – with consultation, environmental assessment and ground investigations at the present time. The next step will be ecological protection and

removal of some vegetation to aid site access, before setting up the site compounds. After the work, in the second half of 2022, access routes, fencing, road surfaces and drainage will be restored, vegetation will be replaced and topsoil made good following the works.

Corinne Price, the Head Gardener from the Swiss Gardens, gave an excellent historic account up to the present date of the garden, its village and the reason behind the name. I am excited to revisit soon as I will view it with new-found knowledge and see it completely differently from my previous visits. In the near future they are planning to open in the evening with a delightful display of illuminated garden lights.

We welcome at our next meeting on the 1st November two of our in-house flower arrangers to demonstrate Christmas wreath making - in plenty of time for our festive season. This is an evening not to be missed!

A diary reminder for January: Gardening Club will be the second Tuesday, the only date I could arrange for Rob MacLeod to attend and speak to us about "pruning". He is an excellent speaker so we all look forward to his knowledge and advice.

## Sudden Wealth Syndrome: dealing with a financial windfall



### In Memoriam: A Tribute To Eric Larsen

Eric John Larsen (EJ)

19 September 1936 –

11 September 2021



# Eric was born on 19th September 1936 in Llandudno, Wales, although he didn't often admit that...!

He was the only child of Hans Frederick and Emily May Larsen and, as such, he was much loved and, dare it be said, possibly a little spoilt by them both.

Although christened as Eric John Larsen he became known to most who knew him as simply "EJ", borne from a request to his somewhat adult children to not call him "dad" in his local Hostelry The Sugar Loaf. Tracy however always preferred to call him Dad as she felt it a privilege to be able to do so, and who can disagree with that sentiment. In adherence to his aforementioned request, and certainly not out of any disrespect, we can continue to refer to him as "EJ".

EJ's parents, with young EJ in tow, moved to Meppershall in 1937 when his father took up a position with one of the many nurseries that Meppershall in the day contained.

EJ attended Meppershall school, as subsequently did his 4 children, 11 grandchildren and even some of his great grandchildren. He temporarily attended the local cub scouts pack until he was invited to leave due to his "scampish misbehaviour", a sign of things to come perhaps?

He was a very keen footballer and subsequently a very keen supporter of Luton Town, where he held season tickets for a number of years. One occasion comes to mind when he even managed to get a place in one of the teams in Meppershall's once famous, well perhaps notorious, Boxing Day football match that took place annually between the social club and the sugar loaf. EJ played on a rain soaked, muddy pitch in his plimsoles, for which he blamed his performance on the day, nothing to do with his sixty years of age at the time....

EJ started his working life in an apprenticeship as a car mechanic. However with the promise of being taught how to drive he was poached from the garage to become a milk delivery boy for the local business Jepps's Dairy, his training vehicle being the milk float! Nonetheless his lifelong love of cars has certainly rubbed off on the male side of his family. Much to the frustration of anyone living on Fildyke road.

At the age of 18 he volunteered for service into the British army where he served for three years followed by a further four years as an enlisted reservist. It was during his time in the army that he had a significant posting to Hobbs Barracks in Lingfield, Surrey. Of course EJ shared his time between the Barracks and the local pubs and it was in one of the local pubs that he met Pauline, his soon to be wife for over 60 years.

Leaping forwards a few years to 1968, EJ's dad died suddenly in a road traffic accident. EJ took the loyal but often challenging decision to take over his dad's nursery, which was full of salad crops growing in the greenhouses and surrounding land. EJ and Pauline decided to build a new family home in the garden of his parents' family home where EJ had spent his childhood, until, according to his mother, the army stole him away.

As was said, the decision was a challenging one to make at the time but no comparison in magnitude to the challenges EJ and Pauline faced in maintaining his father's legacy until EJ retired in 2018. EJ was certainly very proud of what he achieved in maintaining and expanding his father's business. He was always most proud to show customers around his, by now, flower growing business. Many local people were frequent customers for his bedding plants, hanging baskets, cut Roses and pot plants.

It was always a close run thing but EJ really was even more proud of his growing family, 4 offspring, 11 grandchildren and 12 great grandchildren, tinged with great sadness that he wasn't able to meet his 13th great grandchild due to EJ's hospitalisation nor his would be 14th great grandchild due in November. EJ could often be heard proudly stating "not bad for a single child", although certainly Pauline had something to do with it all too.

EJ would often look forward to meeting his mates in he Sugar Loaf for a few beers, frequently encouraged by Pauline so that she could have the lead on what was watched on the telly! Those few beers would usually be followed by a few more beers followed by some sort of practical jokes and other non-malicious mischief. As his Army officer allegedly told him "I've put you up for promotion Larsen because if you are capable of leading men into trouble you must be equally capable of getting them out of it".

In latter years EJ enjoyed his membership of local Crib and Dominoes teams, again partaking in a few beers and equally important reminiscing about the old days with his opposition, most of whom knew EJ from his years gone by.

He maintained his love for football into his latter years and, usually because he enjoyed the banter, his support for his Fathers native Denmark grew stronger, both for the football team and for the country. He would visit his family there as often as health and opportunity would allow and has asked family members to deposit at least some of his ashes within the grounds of his family home just outside Copenhagen, the home his grandfather had built and which his father had grown up in prior to leaving for the UK. We are apparently waiting for family volunteers to conduct this, probably unlawful, act.

A number of you will no doubt remember EJ for his predilection for singing. He sang professionally in bands in his younger days and he was always welcomed to give a song at karaoke. Copenhagen, the Algarve, Meppershall social club, to name a few but in reality it would be any karaoke, anywhere, preferably within fifty miles of his location at any given time. Even his funeral service didn't escape the dulcet tones of EJ, thankfully.

EJ absolutely lived his life to the full and certainly didn't shy away from any challenge and he would be hoping that all reading this would accept his challenge to enjoy yourselves, be happy and do your best to follow his example.

#### **Our Grandad**

He was a husband, a father, a grandfather, a great grandfather, a friend, a drinking buddy; someone you couldn't wait to tell good news to.

To everyone else he was more than this: but to us, he was our grandad.

He was the type of grandad to join in the fun and games, the type of grandad to come down to our level, the type of grandad to break two ribs sledding down a Swiss mountain at 72 years of age!

As children he would make us laugh, wrestle with us, be silly with us - and he didn't change at all as he was exactly the same with our children, who all adore him just as we do.

He always taught us that you don't get anything for nothing, so he was always finding jobs here and there for us to earn some pocket money. Whether it be working the summer holidays down the nursery or odd jobs in the house and garden, he would find something he wanted doing. Part of me thinks he just wanted an excuse to treat us, as I remember he used to reward Dean for keeping his own football boots clean!

As adults he became more of a friend, someone who before he said 'hello' would say, 'want a beer?'

Especially at Christmas, if you got in and out the house without sharing a drink it was a rarity. It became a military operation, a plan of sorts. My plan was to stand up early, as if to say, 'Right, I'm off'... but I would still be standing there 20 minutes later with another glass of beer in hand. I can't mention Christmas without a note about Grandad's punch. If you know, you know!

Just to summarise: he was a child, a friend, a father figure, a role model and a bad influence all rolled into one for us. I know the term 'legend' is used a lot these days but I think it genuinely applies to our grandad.

We didn't think this day would ever come.


We always thought you were immortal... invincible... grandad will be here forever. But I hate to say it Grandad, there are times when even a Larsen just has to admit that they were wrong.




