





Dear Editors

It has been brought to the attention of the Meppershall Players that H.A.T.S. drama group is being blamed for the Players not being at Meppershall Village Hall. This is totally untrue; back in 2018 the Players encouraged H.A.T.S. to come to the New Hall being built at Meppershall, as their lovely theatre at Henlow Camp would be going, along with the RAF base, in the-not-too-distant future The idea was that we the Players would have our Wednesday evening (which we'd had since 1972) with H.A.T.S taking the Monday after Brownies. We the Players also envisaged an amalgamation with H.A.T.S a few years down the line.

Unfortunately this was not to be, as after a meeting with members of the Village Hall committee, it was made clear to the Players that someone else wanted to hire the hall for one hour on Wednesday evening (not H.A.T.S.), although the Players wanted to retain their two hours on a Wednesday evening, paying the requested hire charge. It was made clear by the Village Hall members present that the Players were not wanted on a Wednesday evening, it was even suggested that we move to a Sunday morning.

The Players decided to go to the STMA (Shefford Town Memorial Association) Digswell Hall at Shefford, where we now meet on a Monday evening and have been made to feel very welcome by the STMA committee. In many ways the Village Hall members present at that meeting did the Players a huge favour, as we could never have afforded to kit the stage out at Meppershall; and we would never have experienced how lovely the committee members are down at the STMA, where nothing is too much trouble and there's always a solution if any problems arise, with give and take on both sides.

Thanks everyone for your continued support - and please support H.A.T.S. So many amateur drama groups have folded due to lack of support both in the audience and on the stage. The Players, like H.A.T.S., always welcome new members. We love entertaining our wonderful audiences. Meppershall Parish Council – Approved Minutes

An Ordinary Meeting of Meppershall Parish Council (MPC) took place on Monday 13th December.

Public Session

CBC Ward Councillors Mark Liddiard provided an update on Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) activities:

- New defibrillator Would welcome funding application via Ward Councillor grant scheme.
- COVID numbers The number of recorded Omicron cases in CBC is now 22 confirmed and 4+ suspected. CBC are issuing a plea to all residents to get jabbed. The vaccination centre at Priory House is accepting walk ins. Over 2000 vaccinations were administered over the previous weekend.
- Festive season waste collections Collections will be on Thursday and not Wednesdays over the Christmas and New Year holidays. Christmas trees can be recycled at local Tidy Tips or with recycled waste.
- Housing Allocation Scheme MPC encouraged to respond.
- Community & Village Hall consultation To be issued shortly by CBC.

Questions / comments from the public

- Is Cllr Liddiard available to attend a meeting with Cllr Dalgarno and MPC on 12th January? *Unfortunately not*.
- Is there any update on the resurfacing of footpaths in Brookside and Brookmead? Cllr Liddiard Yes, 3 areas have been highlighted to the CBC Highways team for resurfacing and they include Brookside, Brookmead and Shefford Road. These will be added to their Asset Management Plan.
- What does it mean 'added to the Asset Management Plan'? The Asset Management Plan is a 'priority list' that includes Highways assets that require maintenance (repair or replace). Addition to the list does not guarantee work will be done but adds it to the maintenance plan and schedule.

Procedures, Consultations and Legal

i. Co-Option

The Clerk had previously circulated the application of Mr W Addy (present at the meeting) to all councillors and confirmed having spoken to him at length regarding the role. Councillors commented on how impressed they were with the application and felt that his skills would be beneficial to the Council. *Council resolved to co-opt Mr Addy.*

Cllr Addy signed a Declaration of Acceptance of Office before the Clerk and Proper Officer and was then asked to join councillors in deliberating the business of the meeting by the Chairman.

ii. Procedures

a. Council resolved to re-approve MPC Application for Financial Assistance v2.0, Reserves Policy v1.0 and Document Retention Policy v1.0.

b. Council resolved that the Clerk open another bank account for savings and transfer no more than £85k into it, and that members of the Finance Working Group and the Clerk be appointed signatories to the new account.

iii. Consultations

Councillors considered to what extent the proposed changes to CBC's Housing Allocation Scheme would affect Meppershall residents. For new affordable housing allocations in the village, Meppershall residents should be given priority as they are people with local connections to the village. Councillors agreed that they would support changes that placed importance on local family community cohesion and looked after all generations of the community. Council resolved that the Clerk respond to the Housing Allocation Scheme consultation in support of proposed changes especially where the emphasis is on supporting residents with a local connection.

iv. IT – Website and Email

Cllr Standbridge reported that the gov.uk domain is now available and a changeover will take place in January 2022 (website first and then emails to follow). 477 people visited our website in the last month. The Clerk and Cllr Standbridge will schedule review of the MPC logo after the gov.uk changeover has been completed.

v. Centenary Field Parish Facilities

- i. The Clerk reported that Croudace are yet to confirm receipt of the Settlement Agreement and land transfer and send us a signed copy of the documentation however all funds have been received from them. The water meter has not yet been handed over.
- ii. The Clerk confirmed that wording of the Project Practical Completion Certificate had been altered and approved by MPC Solicitor. Council resolved that Cllrs Thompson and Chapman, together with the Clerk sign the Project Practical Completion Certificate as confirmed by the MPC Solicitor.
- iii. The Clerk and Cllr Morgan met with Sheriffs on 17th November with regards to planned works to Centenary Field and agreed the following:
 - Sheriffs to provide an invoice for works completed to date on pitch (rolling, fertiliser and cutting).
 - Due to weather conditions it would not be advisable to carry out landscaping and drainage works until early spring March / April. This will require requoting due to costs having increased. When on site machinery will be secured in the pitch area.
 - Revised quotes to be provided for all areas
 - Heras Fencing MPC to remove Heras fencing facing Village Hall and leave track fencing in situ. Sheriffs will re-install fencing as required prior to works starting.
 - Area of MPC/MVH car park will be boarded for material to be deposited on. Amenity lands will not be usable until grass is re-instated. Topsoil removed for running track will be re-used to enlarge top left hand corner of track and to create the bunds (banks of earth). All other material will be deposited on site near hedge to avoid cost of removal.

vi. Stocken House Green Space

- i. Ross Williams appointed as Solicitors acting on behalf of MPC. She has been liaising with Davidson's solicitors and working at pace and efficiency. Both The Clerk and Cllr Thompson have been impressed with the quality of communication and advice provided so far.
- ii. MPC Solicitors have suggested purchasing indemnity insurance at a cost of £250 when the contract with Davidsons is completed. Indemnity insurance as opposed to searches has been suggested because of the potential for delay. An assumed indemnity cover amount of £500,000 is proposed which is bit of a stab in the dark. Ordinarily we would get insurance for the value of the property (if a house) as that is the potential maximum loss. Searches would cost more than this insurance. Procedures and legal working group consider this a prudent expenditure. Council resolved that MPC purchase indemnity insurance via MPC solicitors regarding Stocken House Green Space.

vii. Wry Close Allotment Track

Council resolved to approve 6 month extension to Licence Agreement between MPC and the Sugarloaf PH permitting anchoring of a gazebo on Wry Close Allotment track with inclusion of review meeting in June 2022.

Finance

i. Grant applications - Cllr Thompson did not participate in this part of the meeting having previously declared an interest. Cllr Parsons took over as Chairman of the meeting for this agenda item. The Messenger grant application was circulated to councillors with meeting papers. The £750 was requested to assist with the purchase of 100% recycled paper for future printing use. Council resolved to approve grant application of £750 to Meppershall Messenger (Local Government Act 1972, s.142).

ii. Purchase orders

- i. Council resolved that the Clerk attend the Practitioners' Virtual Conference at a cost of £75.
- ii. CBC Highways have advised that there is a £500 per site cost for traffic monitoring assessments. The Clerk has contacted the OPCC who have stated that "The funds issued should be used to achieve the outcomes mentioned in your bid, it will be for your project to decide how the money are spent to delivery those outcomes". Therefore it is assumed they can be used for payment of traffic monitoring. Monitoring will be conducted prior to Christmas at the following locations:
 - The entrance to the village on Shefford Road,
 - High Street heading towards the School between Fowlers Drive and Gregory Close,
 - Fildyke Road heading towards High Street between Chapel Road and Lyspitt Common and,
 - At some point between 32 Shefford Road and the location of the existing VAS on Shefford Road (to replace this VAS).

The Clerk was asked to confirm with CBC who would be responsible for VAS maintenance post installation. *Council resolved to approve £2000 cost of traffic monitoring assessments as part of VAS installation suitability.*

- **iii. Precept and budget 2022-2023 -** This item will be deferred to the next meeting. The Clerk was asked to arrange a Finance Working Group meeting on 4th January at 10am to review the draft budget prior to presentation at the next meeting.
- **iv. Standing orders and direct debits -** *Resolved to approve updated standing orders and direct debit list as presented and signed by Councillors.*
- v. **Document approval** Council resolved that Bank Statements and Reconciliation reports 150 Current Account and 025 Savings Account be approved and signed.
- vi. Orders for the payment of money Council resolved that the schedule of payments as presented be approved and authorised for payment by Cllrs Thompson or Parsons.

Planning and Housing

a. Planning applications

- i. **CB/21/04142/OUT The Airman Hotel, SG17 5JF** Outline Application: extension to the existing hotel to provide an additional 30 en-suite bedrooms and the erection of 9 self-contained lodges. The existing car park to be expanded and remodelled to provide a total of 80 car parking spaces. A new point of access from the Hitchin Road to provide a delivery access with turning and unloading facilities and 15 staff car parking spaces. Landscaping and biodiversity enhancements. All matters reserved apart from access. *Council resolved that the Council objects on the grounds of highways issues, design, impact on landscape and environment and noise pollution*.
- ii. **CB/21/04098/FULL Meppershall Airfield, Campton Road** Two new 3 bedroom semi-detached staff dwellings. *Council resolved to object on the grounds of impact on landscape and noise.*
- iii. **CB/21/04970/FULL The Mow, Hoo Road, SG17 5LP** Erection of 9 residential dwellings and all ancillary works. *Council resolves to object on the grounds of contrary to policy, design and layout, environmental and landscaping issues and other identified issues.*

Neighbourhood Plan

The Chair to the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group reported that the grant application for £2,740 has been approved and money should be with MPC shortly. The plan is under review by the Clerk and Mrs Chapman. Mr Pain will arrange to remove the Regulation 14 banners shortly.

Highways and Transport

The Clerk advised that:

- Hoo Road Bridleway Bollards Damage and removal of bollards reported to CBC ROW officer with photos
- Footpath outside Sugarloaf to be replaced in early 2022.

 Meeting with Cllr Ian Dalgarno – Highways portfolio holder on 27/11 to discuss Meppershall OPCC funding and issue. He has advised that the CBC draft SID Policy is pending. Meeting with CBC Portfolio holder Ian Dalgarno arranged for Wednesday 12th January at 2:00pm (Cllr Morgan to attend).

Environment and Leisure

- **a.** Tree planting plans Councillors asked for this cost to be included in the 2022-2023 budget.
- **b. ORM development plans -** Councillors asked for this cost to be included in the 2022-2023 budget.
- **c. MPC Signage** Council resolved that the Clerk organise the purchase and installation of all required signage in MPC owned locations and also the installation of noticeboards.

d. Allotments

- i. Circa £879 received in allotment rent with £770 pending.
- ii. Mr B J Foster has quoted £1348 to replace 5 support gates holding stop cocks, supply and fit 6 replacement taps and supply and fit new isolating stop cock on supply pipe from High Street. Council Resolved to accept quotation for tap repairs and replacement and associated works from Mr BJ Foster at a cost of £1348. The Clerk was also asked to engage with Mr Foster regarding Phase 2 works on the allotments to increase access to water facilities.
- A request has been made to rent 2 allotment plots in order to cultivate flowers for commercial sale. The Clerk has not provided a definitive response pending council guidance and resolution. Councillors reviewed the MPC Allotment Tenancy Agreement and associated documentation that follows the key legal restriction contained in the Allotments Act 1922, whereby there is a general prohibition on any "trade or business" being conducted on the allotment garden. An allotment garden must, by definition, "be wholly or mainly cultivated for the production of vegetable or fruit crops (MPC added in flowers) for consumption by the occupier or his family". The MPC Allotment tenancy agreement makes reference to "A small amount of surplus produce may be sold as ancillary to the provision of crops for the family". MPC allotment tenancies do not currently allow for the renting of plots for commercial production. MPC allotments are subsidised by the Parish Council and therefore any commercial gain made by tenants may be considered an inappropriate use of public funds. Council resolved not to permit the renting of allotment plots for commercial cultivation.

Health and Safety

a. Old Road Meadow Risk Assessment - The Clerk and Mrs Thorne completed a Risk Assessment at ORM on 7th December. Upon review councillors requested that the Clerk discuss with the CBC Rights of Way Officer access to ORM via Fildyke Road. *Council resolved to confirm receipt of ORM Risk assessment.*

- b. Special Constable to cover Meppershall with Shillington and Gravenhurst The Chair of Shillington PC has contacted the Clerk and Gravenhurst Parish Council to see if we are interested in supporting a Special Constable that would cover Meppershall, Shillington and Gravenhurst. CBC Cllr Graham has spoken to the PCC and the Beds Police Chief Constable who are discussing it seriously. They are happy for villages to start to try to identify interested people in their communities as of now, as it cooperates with the force. Dividing a Special's commitment between villages would be fine. The official recruitment and training will take at least a year, before the specials would be operational in their communities. Although councillors were supportive of this initiative they had many unanswered questions such as:
 - Would any financial contribution from MPC be required?
 - Would we have a guarantee that the Special Constable would be working in our area?
 - How many hours would they work a week / month?

Councillors requested that the Clerk and the Chair request more information on the proposal and perhaps ask the PCC to attend one of our meetings to discuss.

Staffing – Training – Council resolved that the Clerk enrol Mrs Thorne on the ROSPA Visual Inspection Training course.

What is a councillor?

Councillors are elected or co-opted to represent a geographical ward or parish, in Meppershall it is the entire parish. They are generally elected by the public every four years, but there are co-option spaces available on the Parish Council at the moment due to previous resignations.

What do councillors do?

Councillors have three main components to their work:

- Decision making Through meetings and attending committees with other elected members, councillors decide which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies should be implemented.
- Monitoring Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well things are working.
- 3. Getting involved locally As local representatives, councillors have responsibilities towards their constituents and local organisations. These responsibilities and duties often depend on what the councillor wants to achieve and how much time is available, and may include:
 - · Going to meetings of local organisations such as the Beds Police Priority Setting Meetings
 - · Reviewing planning applications
 - · Participating in litter picks
 - · Taking up issues on behalf of members of the public

How much time does it take up?

Quite often councillors say that their duties occupy them for about an hour a week. 



Time to get FIT - Bowel Cancer Screening

FIT or faecal immunochemical test, is a free bowel cancer screening test for those aged over 60.

So, let's rid the taboo about poo! This simple, lifesaving test is easier than you may think; most of us are able to do this independently, and in the privacy of our own bathroom. You can't always see the signs and tests can detect early signs of cancer. When spotted early, treatment is more likely to be successful and most will survive bowel cancer when an early diagnosis is made.

The statistics can be difficult to read; around one in 15 men and one in 18 women will have bowel cancer in their lifetime; with over 42,000 people being diagnosed and 268,000 living with bowel cancer in the UK each year.

Although more commonly found in those aged 50 and over, around 2,500 people under 50 are diagnosed each year.

For those aged 60-74, a FIT kit will be sent automatically by post, and repeated every two years; those older can ask to be tested by calling the free NHS helpline 0800 707 6060.

If you have symptoms which can include blood in your poo, a change in your normal bowel habits, a pain or lump in your abdomen, weight loss or tiredness for no obvious reason, then make an appointment with your doctor or nurse practitioner without delay.

Council launches new survey

Central Bedfordshire Council has launched a new cyber crime survey and is encouraging members of the public to take part.

Cyber crime is the term given to criminal activity that either targets or uses a computer, or a networked device such as a mobile phone. The aim for most cyber criminals is to achieve financial gain.

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) suggests that people are more likely to become a victim of cyber crime and fraud than any other type of crime, but it is significantly

under reported. Therefore, in its 2021-2024 strategy, the Community Safety Partnership — made up of Bedfordshire Police, Central Bedfordshire Council, Bedfordshire Fire and Rescue Services, National Probation Services and Bedfordshire's Clinical Commissioning Group - identified cyber crime as an 'emerging priority'.

Central Beds Pilots New Digital Online Support For Unpaid Carers

Central Bedfordshire Council has teamed up with digital provider Mobilise to pilot a new service to connect unpaid carers. The three-month pilot project started on 29 November and will use social media and digital marketing to help to find and identify unpaid carers, connecting them immediately with others in a similar position, and providing relevant, timely support. The service is free.

Mobilise will work in partnership with the existing carers support services provided by Carers in Bedfordshire and Central Bedfordshire Council, offering a range of online support, from regular contact through emails, guide to caring e-course to 'virtual cuppas' and even individual support calls - seven days a week.

Around 30,000 people in Central Bedfordshire – that's around 10 per cent of the local population – are thought to be unpaid carers.

Councillor Carole Hegley, Executive Member for Adult Social Care at Central Bedfordshire Council, said: "Many residents who provide unpaid care do not see themselves as carers because they are simply doing what they can for a relative, a friend or a neighbour who needs them because of their disability or illness. By connecting carers, we can ensure they are supported, particularly during the difficult winter months, and can continue to provide their crucial care. Mobilise is a great way for people to connect and receive support from others who can relate to their similar and shared experiences."

Suzanne Bourne, Co-founder and Head of Carer Support at Mobilise, stated: "There are carers out there who may need advice who are not currently accessing it. Creating a Mobilise carer peer support network in Central Bedfordshire will see an improvement in their wellbeing. Carers are less likely to reach breakdown and require emergency assistance."

Jobs in the Garden for February

- Add manure and slow, release fertiliser around base of roses and flowering shrubs
- Prune late flowering clematis to 30cm above ground
- Cut back deciduous grasses
- Prune Wisteria, hardy evergreen hedges and winter flowering shrubs such as Mahonia and Winter Jasmine
- Prune Buddleia if large down to base to keep to a reasonable size
- Divide herbaceous perennials
- Divide Snowdrops once finished flowering
- Prepare vegatable beds
- Chit potato tubers
- Winter prune fruit trees and add sulphate of potash around the base
- Cut off spent Amaryllis heads but leave stalks to die down naturally
- Sow Sweetpeas in greenhouse or on window sill
- Set up nest boxes
- Wash greenhouse
- If snowy, knock snow off shrubs to prevent damage.





Message from St Mary's

Firstly I hope the new year has got off to a good start for you.

Christmas may seem now to have finished some time ago, but although most of us will have put away our Christmas decorations on 12th night - the Christmas and Epiphany Seasons are only coming to an end in Church on the 2nd Feb when we remember Jesus being presented in the Temple... And then it is time for us to finally pack away the Crib until next year.

This is also the time I must gently remind you to remove Christmas wreaths and decorations from the Churchyard and check that your graves are being looked after according to the guidance laid out in the Diocese of St Albans Churchyard Regulations 2020 at www.stmarysmeppershall.org.uk. Please remember that your memorial stone, if there, remains your responsibility, and check that it is securely in place and not "wobbly". I know that some of the stones in the Churchyard are in need of attention, so if you know that is yours, please do talk to me.

Our desire is to maintain the churchyard as a place that is safe and welcoming for all who wish to use it. We hope that our care, and the care of relatives, for the churchyard and the graves, will maintain it as a place that truly honours the memory of all those buried here.

I often find February a strange month - after winter (?)... but not quite spring; enlivened by Valentine's Day celebrations for some - and then, though not this year, launching us into Lent (Ash Wednesday is 2nd March this year). This year though, I find myself approaching February much more excitedly.

Maybe it is the winter sunshine and blue skies we have been enjoying (even though it is chilly!), maybe it is having the windows open more and listening to the birdsong, maybe it is walking around my garden looking at the patches of bare brown earth and seeing in my mind's eye what was there before that I really hope will come again! In

fact, I have just crunched my way around the garden on the frosted grass and so many plants are already beginning to break through the earth towards the sun, while in a shady corner the purple buds on the hellebores are fit to burst!

(The weather forecast is not quite so promising, and suggests that more winter is coming at the end of the month!)

I remember that one evening when we were driving in the car with our children and the sun was setting - a really beautiful sunset - a little voice in the back of the car said, "Oooh look, Mummy! It's God's painting time!"

And perhaps, if we pause to take it in, each year we are privileged to watch God work on his canvas for the year. The psalmist said:

"The heavens tell about the glory of God.

The skies announce what his hands have made.

Each new day tells more of the story, and each night reveals more and more about God's power.

You cannot hear them say anything.

They don't make any sound we can hear.

But their message goes throughout the world.

(Psalm 91:1 ERV)

I am not usually the most observant of people - but this year I don't want to miss a single brushstroke!

And applying that image to the whole of life now, it looks as though after living a long time with fear and restrictions - we may at last be stepping out into a new season...

I do not know what this year will hold but I pray that we will move forward with God.... recapturing what was good but has been "on hold", and moving forward inspired by new hopes and new dreams and new visions of who we want to be and the world we want to shape around us.







Building financial resilience in the new year

The start of a new year is always the perfect time to take control of your finances and grasp any opportunities that may lie ahead. Millions set to be worse off

The spectre of rising inflation certainly means investors need to carefully consider the composition of their portfolios to ensure their money is potentially inflation-proofed. Consider all the variables

From many people's perspectives, the Autumn Budget may have left a feeling that nothing much had changed in the world of personal financial planning, as there were no major changes announced to Income Tax, Capital Gains Tax, Inheritance Tax or pensions. However, the key consideration is how outside factors such as higher inflation could affect your finances and what steps you should take before the end of the tax year to make the most of any allowances and exemptions.

<u>Inheritance Tax (IHT)</u>

Official figures from HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) for April to September 2021 show that IHT receipts totalled £3.1bn, £0.7bn higher than the same period in 2020. With the nil rate band and residence nil rate band now frozen until April 2026 at £325,000 and £175,000 respectively, the importance of effective estate planning shouldn't be overlooked.

Individual Savings Accounts (ISAs)

The annual ISA limit has now been frozen at £20,000 for five years. If the allowance had increased with inflation each year since 2017, it would stand at £21,440 today, sheltering an additional £1,440 from the taxman. JISAs celebrated their tenth birthday in November – the allowance remains at £9,000.

Dividend Tax

The government revealed in September that it would increase Dividend Tax by 1.25 percentage points from 6 April 2022 to help fund health and social care. This means investors will have to pay more on any Consider all the variables income from shares held outside ISAs and above the £2,000 Dividend Allowance.

Pensions

The Lifetime Allowance remains at £1,073,100 and the Annual Allowance remains at £40,000. As these allowances haven't increased with inflation, it effectively means those saving to the maximum extent possible with tax concessions can save less in real terms each year. Variables at play It's important to be aware of all the variables at play; inflation, interest rates, taxation and frozen allowances all affect your finances.

Getting a mortgage in retirement

These days, it's not uncommon for people to become homeowners later in life. But can you get a mortgage even if you're retired? If so, what's the maximum age?

In Memoriam

Frank Edward "Ted" Ted Putwain, 23 November 2022 - aged 85. Our deep condolences to Brenda and family.

A Tribute to Ted Putwain

Many will know Ted and Brenda from their daily morning walk to get the newspaper – often taking a stroll on the lanes more widely around the village. Ted sadly passed on 23rd November. Here we remember a much loved Meppershall friend and neighbour.

On those walks, Ted loved talking to children and parents on their way to school, often learning new things from them. Ted and Brenda have watched many of them grow to fine young people. Many people may not realise that for many years Ted played Father Christmas for the nursery school. Much planning went into this to keep his real identity secret! Unfortunately, hearing loss made him have to give this up.

Ted was born to Frank and Emily in Croydon. He had an older sister, Pamela, and they moved to Letchworth as a family because of the war. The family rented a house in 'Green Lane' which later the parents bought. Ted and his sister grew up there, going to the local school and children's clubs.

Ted was a member of the swimming club and was a church bell ringer, but he did not last long in the choir or the scouts, as he could not learn his knots.

On leaving school he had an apprenticeship with the local iron foundry (Furnstan and Lawler Ltd) and at North Herts Technical College.

National service with the 1st East Anglian Regiment put a stop to his training. From 3rd September 1959 to 31st August 1961 Ted was based in Bury St Edmunds, Suffolk. He also spent time in Germany. In 1967 Ted returned to his studies with the Institute of Work Study Practitioners.

Around this time he started to work at Vauxhall, later moving on to IBC vehicles.

Brenda was a friend of Pamela who had broken up with her boyfriend. Ted used to come and visit when Brenda was at Pamela's house. Brenda always liked Ted - they used to talk and became friends. One night when Brenda was working at a pub, Ted arrived for a drink. He talked Brenda into going away for a weekend with him. Ted used to sail '505' dinghies. He was competing in open meetings around the country. So Brenda was to meet him at the bottom of their road at 6:30am (with the boat on the trailer he could not come up to the house at that time in the morning!) Brenda surprised her parents on arriving home to tell them that she was going to Hastings for the weekend with a man that they did not know!

Brenda knew that if all else failed, she had an aunt and uncle who lived in Hastings. But Ted and Brenda had a lovely weekend, they never stopped talking and getting to know each other, with other wives and girlfriends looking after Brenda while Ted was sailing.

Ted asked Brenda to marry him after his firm's Christmas dinner, on the way home. Brenda realised she would not like life without him. A date was set for the wedding, 24th April 1971. Following the wedding, they set up home in a bungalow in Shefford

with much of the work building cupboards, shelves and wardrobes being completed by Ted in his spare time.

Family life began with the birth of son Martin in 1973 and later Ian in 1975. Ted delivered him at home and all the hospital staff congratulated him on doing a good job (even though they lost out on being paid for a hospital birth!)

As time went on and the boys grew up, Ted took them to a swimming club. He was asked to train as a swimming teacher, which he did every Monday evening, until one night he could not hear a small child asking to leave the pool to go to the loo. Ted was having trouble with his hearing and had started wearing hearing aids. He decided it was time to retire from this activity.

Both Ted and Brenda became involved with Cubs and Scouts as they had two boys in the pack, when both leaders left they were encouraged to take the training and become the leaders. Ted started as a Cub leader, later becoming the Group Scout Leader, and finally running the Scout shop with Gill when Norman became too ill to continue in this role.

On retiring from his day job at IBC vehicles, Ted maintained the school swimming pool for two years. He was also a driver for the 'Wanderbus' every week until age forced his retirement from this activity. Ted was always busy, cutting the church grass, doing the books for the village magazine, and at Christmas time he would help build props and sets for the village pantomime.


Ted and Brenda were married for fifty years, with life's ups and downs; throughout, Ted was a good kind family man, and Ted and Brenda were always good friends first. Family was so important to him and he and Brenda enjoyed their five grandchildren - Ben, Esme, Ella, Sophie and Charlie.

Ted was 85 years old but had always had a busy full life. The last two years were very hard, with almost complete hearing loss. He had planned to have implants, but cancer put a stop to that. Brenda will miss him very much.


