

Letters to the Editors

Dear Editors

I noticed that in this month's Messenger there is a letter from a resident regarding the hedgerow on Shefford Road that has been removed.

I'm not sure if anyone has responded to this but thought I might give you a little information if you would like to create a response.

There are actually 2 development sites on Shefford Road (excluding Emery Gardens at 32 Shefford Road). The first site is Stocken House where Davidson Homes are the developers building 145 homes.

The second site is land opposite 34 to 42 Shefford Road where John Burgess and Co Ltd are the developers building 9 homes.

The Parish Council objected to both planning applications regarding the removal of the longstanding hedgerows but were only successful in having them replanted. Davidsons Homes have already replanted hedgerow whips (small plants) on their site frontage. John Burgess and Co Ltd are yet to plant their replacement. Both developers should be planting a mixed native hedgerow that must remain in place. In both instances issues concerning 'highways visibility splays' were the reason stated for removal of the hedgerows.

Luke was kindly contributing his skills, experience and equipment after a number of jobs in different kinds of maintenance and gardening work. Some will also know him for giving his time to spread salt in snowy and icy weather on Crackle Hill Road.

One of the more intriguing tasks he has had with DJ Granger is the maintenance of local water towers – including the famous Meppershall Water Tower!

Meppershall Parish Council – Approved Minutes

An Ordinary Meeting of Meppershall Parish Council (MPC) took place on Monday 10th January 2022.

Chairman's announcements

- Reported crime statistics for Meppershall show that the number plummeted in December from 13 to 7 which is a positive sign.
- NALC (National Association of Local Councils) have issued their response to DEFRA's environmental consultation and included the concerns raised by MPC and many other parish councils.

Public Session - CBC Ward Councillors Liddiard and Brown provided an update on Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) activities:

- Population Predicted population growth figures for Central Bedfordshire have been released. Current population = 294,000. Prediction (2031) = 321,000.
- Council tax collection In 2021 CBC collected 96.1% of council tax due (against an average for England of 95.7%).
- Council tax 2022-23 Consultation currently underway. CBC wishes to increase council tax by an overall 1.95% (1% for social care and 0.95% for frontline services). Despite revenue from council tax CBC will still need to find savings of £5.9million.
- Grass cutting subsidy Query has been raised with CBC officers regarding the subsidy paid to parish councils that has not increased in many years despite costs increasing.
- Footpath replacement The footpath outside the Sugar Loaf PH is to be resurfaced on 31st January 2022.
- Schools for the Future A meeting will be held on 20th January when it is hoped to confirm timings for the Shefford and Stotfold cluster move to twotier. Children will continue to attend their current schools until changes are made and consultations conducted.
- COVID update COVID numbers are the highest they have ever been with more people in hospital. CBC is urging residents to get vaccinated and have their booster.
- Government grants More grants are now available to businesses in the hospitality sector and applications can be made via the CBC website.
- A00176 Traffic Calming Notice Ward Councillors are interested in MPC feedback regarding agenda item 738.a (proposed traffic speed calming tables outside 32 Shefford Road.

Questions / comments from the public:

- CBC is to be commended for their organisation of the vaccine centre at Priory House and the minibus issuing lateral flow test kits that recently visited Meppershall. When we hear about what is happening elsewhere in the country, we realise how lucky we are in this regard. It was requested that the Chairman email the CBC Director of Public health to offer our appreciation.
- Are businesses being notified of the business grants available from CBC? ML –
 Yes, previous applicants are being notified.
- Housing developments along Shefford Road (Stocken House and land opposite 34 to 42 Shefford Road) have removed all of the historic hedge. Will the hedge be replaced with proper semi mature hedging plants rather than whips? Clerk to check planning permission granted and email Planning Officers.

Procedures, Consultations and Legal

i. **Co-Option** – No new requests received. The Clerk was asked to submit another article to the Messenger.

ii. Procedures

a. Council resolved re-adopt MPC COVID Safe Risk Assessment until April 2022.

b. Council resolved to approve proposed MPC Meeting Date Schedule until March 2023 (meeting in July to be changed to 25th July).

iii. Consultations

Councillors considered their responses to budget consultations from CBC, Bedfordshire Fire and Rescue and Bedfordshire Police. CBC plan to increase council tax by 1.95% (1% for adult social care and 0.95% for funding other services). Beds Fire and Rescue propose to increase council tax by 1.99%. Beds Police want to increase council tax by £10 a year for a band D property but have provided no more information. All budget proposals are under consultation. Council resolved that the Clerk respond to in support of CBC and Beds Fire and Rescue budget consultations but question proposals made by Beds Police for lack of information and clarity. Carried.

iv. IT – Website and Email

Cllr Standbridge reported that the gov.uk domain changeover will take place after Friday 14th January (website first and then emails to follow). Changes have been made to the website – dedicated Gnomes page added and addition of Noticeboard for stories. Views of the site have increased by 20%.

v. Stocken House Green Space

- i. Ross Williams continues to liaise with Davidson's solicitors. The Clerk has arranged to meet with Mr Alderman who has agreed to assist with monitoring of planting on site. Reports from residents indicate that planting has taken place in some areas.
- ii. Councillors considered an invitation to attend the showhome launch on 29th January, from Davidson's PR company Liberty. They have been in communication with both Messenger editors and the Meppershall Academy (contributed £1.5k to books for school). They have invited local residents who have been raising money for charity to the event and will be contributing to their charitable efforts. In discussing donations, the Clerk mentioned potential donations to an MPC defibrillator fund and Liberty have confirmed today that Davidsons will contribute £1.5k to this. Future residents must be made welcome and feel part of the village. Council resolved that the Chairman and the Clerk attend the Davidson's show home launch event on behalf of MPC.

vi. Collaboration with Gravenhurst Parish Council

Councillors considered the sharing of resources with Gravenhurst Parish Council and any ensuing actions as the Clerk works for both Parish Councils and it may be beneficial for both organisations to share resources e.g.: computer, laptop, mobile phone, however an agreement between both organisations would need to be drawn up to do this. Council resolved that the Procedures and Legal working group put together an agreement for sharing of resources with Gravenhurst Parish Council for approval at the next meeting.

vii. Futures Working Group

Councillors considered the remit, set up and membership of a 'Futures working group' as a next step on from the Neighbourhood Plan, to look at the medium future of the village and how residents may want it to grow. It is envisaged that the working group although supported by MPC would be made up of village residents. Councillors agreed that they would be unhappy to see

a Futures working group that was focussed entirely on residential development even if it would be important to consider whether the village could accept any more development greater than 50 dwellings. The working group should also focus on community, facilities, landscape, environment etc. and should look to address issues such as do we want Meppershall to be considered a commuter village as opposed to promoting local employment. The Clerk and Cllr Parsons were asked to put together a scope / remit of the working group for the next meeting.

Finance

i. Purchase orders

Cllr Thompson did not participate in agenda items 735.a.i to iii having previously declared an interest. Cllr Parsons took over as Chairman of the meeting for these agenda items.

- i. Council resolved the purchase of tables and chairs for MVH Beech meeting room at a cost of £779+VAT and that they be gifted to the Village Hall (Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 s.19).
- ii. Council resolved the purchase of 2 x lockable filing cabinets for MPC archive storage (to be sited at MVH) at cost of £206.88.
- iii. Councillors considered the purchase and installation of a defibrillator to be located at Village Hall in a location approved by MVHT. It was noted that the Shefford Road end of the village is beyond a reasonable distance from the Village Hall for access to a defibrillator and therefore MPC should seek to identify a location for a fourth defibrillator in the village. Council resolved that the Clerk purchase and organise the installation of a defibrillator, housing unit and sign, to be located at the Village Hall, and then seek to organise training via Community Heartbeat.

Cllr Standbridge did not participate in agenda items 735.a.i to iii having previously declared an interest.

- iv. Councillors considered purchase of a mobile phone from Cllr Standbridge at a cost of £40 and confirmed that the mobile phone was in excellent working order. Council resolved that the Council purchase a mobile phone from Cllr Standbridge at a cost of £40.
- v. Councillors considered the cost and selection of mobile phone SIM only contracts for MPC employees and payment methods. The Clerk advised that virtually all mobile phone SIM contracts require payment via a direct debit card unless opting for a more expensive business. Contracts option information was provided. The Clerk offered to reclaim the cost via expenses or to research the use of a Unity Trust Corporate MultiPay Card (MasterCard Charge card £50 set up and £3 per month charge). If Councillors chose to opt for a Corporate MultiPay Card then Financial Regulations would need to be altered. Council resolved that the Clerk apply for a Unity Trust Corporate MultiPay Card, amend Financial Regulations and organise mobile phone contracts with Smarty.

ii. Precept and budget 2022-2023

i. Councillors received a 2021/2022 actual v budgeted spend report that included predicted expenditure until the end of this financial year. The

- report did not include a grant request received from CPRE Bedfordshire for £500 which would go towards supporting their team of planning volunteers and the overall work CPRE do. Councillors agreed that the grant request from CPRE warranted support and should be included in this year's expenditure. Council resolved to approve CRPE Grant request for £500 (LGA 1972, s137).
- ii. Councillors considered the proposed 2022/2023 budget and reserves; the Clerk responded to questions raised on expected expenditure, income and VAT recovery. Minor changes were made to the proposed budget in the meeting. Council resolved to approve the 2022/2023 budget as amended.
- iii. Councillors considered proposed 2022-2023 precept options and based upon the approved budget explained the impact on both general and earmarked reserves. Councillors discussed the merits and impact of each option and also other increases in council tax proposed by CBC, the Fire Service and Beds Police. Council resolved to approve and to set a precept of £59,235 which equates to Band D Council Tax charge of £61.55 (increase of 2.00% or £1.22 on 2022-2022). Clerk to write an article for the Messenger.
- iii. Document approval Council resolved to alter the banking mandate to include Cllr Addy and that Bank Statements and Reconciliation reports 151 and 152 Current Account and 026 Savings Account be approved and signed.
- iv. Orders for the payment of money Council resolved that the schedule of payments as presented be approved and authorised for payment by Cllrs Thompson or Parsons.

Planning and Housing

a. Planning applications – None received for consideration.

Neighbourhood Plan

The grant application for £2740 has been received. The plan is under review by the Clerk and Mrs Chapman.

Highways and Transport

- **a. CBC Highways Consultation** Councillors considered a response to A00176 Traffic Calming Notice (2 x raised tables located near 34A and 36 Shefford Road and 28 Shefford Road. *Council resolved that the Clerk requesting a single raised table.*
- b. OPCC grant funding update from Clerk (traffic monitoring and VAS installation) Data from the traffic monitoring conducted pre-Christmas not yet received. Confirmation that monitoring tubes on Fildyke Road were in the wrong place and were moved was received on 14th December. A meeting with the CBC Highways Portfolio Holder, Cllr Ian Dalgarno is now planned for 21st January with both Cllrs Liddiard and Morgan in attendance.

Environment and Leisure

a. Centenary Field - The pitch area has been secured with new combination locks. Revised quotations are still pending from Sherriffs. Cllr Morgan and Cllr Standbridge will organise a video to publicise the current situation, explain the works that will commence in March / April and the implications of the works

- on access. Cllr Thompson wished to thank all those who has assisted in moving the Heras fencing facing the Village Hall off site.
- **b.** Allotments A few plot holders' payments are pending and the Clerk is actively chasing these. Two plot holders have given up their plots. The Clerk was asked to put an article in the Messenger regarding plot vacancies. Councillors also noted that a number had received complaints from plot holders regarding the allotment track holes. Council resolved that the Clerk organise / purchase of 'sieved' road plainings for delivery to the allotments.
- c. Great British Spring Clean Councillors considered participation in the Great British Spring Clean between 25th March to 10th April 2022 and agreed that they would like the village to participate. *Council resolved that the Clerk organise publicity for a village spring clean on Saturday 26th March, check stocks of litter pickers and other accessories required, and order 10 hoops, 12 litter pickers and gloves as required.*

Centenary Field Update

Meppershall Parish Council is pleased to announce that the ownership of Centenary Field has been finally transferred from Croudace Homes to MPC.

It has taken time to complete the transfer after development finished on site because of the need to reach an agreement over the poor state of Centenary Field post development; field drainage is inadequate and water is pooling to the rear of the village hall, the pitch surface is uneven and requires refurbishment, landscaping is poor in areas and trees need replacing.

In the coming months, MPC will be working on refurbishment, management and maintenance. Before the summer of 2022 we have planned:

- Installing of land drainage on Centenary Field and to the rear of the Village Hall.
- Landscaping repairs on Centenary Field and around the Village Hall together with re-seeding and measure to prevent unauthorised encampments.
- Creation of a track / path around the fenced pitch that links to current paths.
- Refurbishment of pitch including new top soil and reseeding.
- Installation of new outdoor gym equipment.
- Necessary signage and information boards.

We hope that works will be carried out concurrently and are discussing with contractors and the Village Hall best timings for works which includes making allowance for the weather.

Where possible we will ensure that areas are open for use by residents and Village Hall hirers but, for safety reasons and also to ensure that works carried out such as grass seeding are given time to grow and re-establish, planned works will require the closure of areas of Centenary Field and around the Village Hall. We do not envisage closing play areas although they may be fenced off field side to prevent entry into the field whilst works are happening. Refurbishment of the pitch will mean that it cannot be used until 2023 and therefore this area will remain locked. We hope that people will respect areas that are closed for use.

Later in the year we also plan to:

- Install new play equipment
- Plant trees to include two oaks to commemorate HM The Queen's Platinum Jubilee.
- Clear areas of the copse with a view to starting on creating an area of contemplation and remembrance for future use.

As work progresses, we will provide updates for residents in the Messenger, on our website www.meppershall-pc.gov.uk, on Facebook (MPC and Meppershall Noticeboard) and obviously at our monthly meetings (every second Monday of the month at the Village Hall from 7pm). Meppershall Parish Council

Parish Council Precept

In addition to the Police, Fire Services and Central Bedfordshire Council, our Parish Council receives money from your council tax bills. This is called the precept.

At the Parish Council meeting on Monday 10th January, Meppershall Parish Council agreed to request a precept of £59,235 for the financial year 2022-2023 to be raised through council tax payments from all the dwellings within the parish area to help support parish council services and activities.

This is an increase of 2.00% compared to the previous financial year's contribution. Using a Band D Council Tax dwelling as an example, this is a £1.22 increase over the whole year. In 2022-2023 it will be £62.55 per year, in 2021-2022 the contribution was £61.33 per Band D dwelling.

In the financial year April 2022 to March 2023 we expect to spend near to £300,000. This includes:

- £67,000 on new play equipment at Centenary Field
- £20,000 on new play equipment at Old Road Meadow
- £20,000 on new outdoor gym equipment at Centenary Field
- £14,000 on a track around the fenced pitch at Centenary Field linking to existing pathways
- £40,000 on land drainage and landscaping in and around Centenary Field
- £25,000 on pitch renovations
- £2,000 on visual display boards
- £13,500 on allotment renovations
- £3,000 on new trees
- £20,000+ on speed reduction measures

There are general running costs of the village too including grass cutting, environmental maintenance of areas including Old Road Meadow, allotments as well as other expenses.

As always Councillors have looked carefully at what is needed in order to keep any increase to a minimum, and to ensure that the reserves are sufficient to cover any unforeseen expenses as well as the agreed level of running costs.





In 2008. at the prompting of the Parish Council, a group of parishioners and representatives of village organisations began work on preparing the Village Plan. This was an attempt to identify the characteristics that made Meppershall what it was and to reflect and record villagers' aspirations and hopes for the future of their place.

The Village Plan was reviewed and updated, beginning in 2014, published in 2017 and included some aspirations which present residents may recognise. In 2017, under the provisions



of the Localism Act, parishes were given the opportunity to prepare a Neighbourhood Plan, the details of which would be recognised in policy planning by the local authority and would be mandated for consideration by planners and developers. Again, a group of Parish Councillors and villagers worked to prepare Meppershall's Plan and the results will be put to the village for approval shortly.

It was never the intention that the Neighbourhood Plan should be the unchanging and final word on the future of the Village. Now it is your turn to engage in the next stage, the preparation of a Future Strategy for our village.

It has never been more true to say that decisions taken out in the wider world will impact on us here, whether we like it or not. What the village can do though is to consult, plan and document new aspirations and guidelines for the planners of the future. To this end the Parish Council are prepared to support and facilitate a Future Strategy group to consult, consider and prepare a plan for the next stage in our village's future.

"Whilst the Parish Council cannot endorse any single developer in Meppershall, it does and will work with all developers to secure positive outcomes for current and future residents of the Parish of Meppershall.

"In this case Davidson Homes are working with the Parish Council on the formal adoption and maintenance of the Public Open Space including the play area at Woodlands Rest. This will enhance the Councils green spaces provision and will benefit all our residents."

Davidsons Homes is to build 145 2- 5 bedroomed new homes at Woodlands Rest, comprising 94 houses for private sale and 51 affordable homes for rent or shared ownership.

As part of the planning agreement for the development, Davidsons Homes will be contributing more than £1.8 million to sustain and improve local services and infrastructure, as well as creating public open space and a play area within the development.

More than £1.7 million of the funding will go towards education, including £614,218 for upper schools, £500,857 towards middle schools, £497,750 for lower schools and a further £149,325 towards early years learning.

What is a CERT?

A CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) is made up of organisations and volunteers willing to respond to a village emergency and to provide support. They are vital in increasing our resilience during emergency incidents such as fires, flooding, disease outbreak, major transport disruption or a loss of utilities.

How does a CERT help the community?

During an emergency, a village CERT may be called in to action by Central Bedfordshire Council to work alongside other emergency responders. As volunteers members are all local, they bring a level of expertise and local knowledge that the emergency services often rely on. We spend the vast majority of our time preparing for large scale emergencies that fortunately rarely occur, however it is often the small-scale emergencies that can have a negative impact on a community and cause disruption.

Who knows what's going to happen?

What would we do if our village water supply suddenly ceased together with the gas supply because a burst water main has ruptured a medium pressure gas main? Water should be restored within 2 days, but the gas supply could take up to 5 days. It's freezing and the forecast is -2 degrees at night over the next week. Snow is also predicted. Villagers need to be careful not to overload the electricity network as this could blow the sub-stations causing widespread power outages. Who will help our vulnerable residents and help the emergency services co-ordinate help for all? The residents of Lockerbie never imagined a 747 falling from the sky and landing in their village! Who would have thought that we would see trees uprooted on the roads of Meppershall?

What is a councillor?

Councillors are elected or co-opted to represent a geographical ward or parish, in Meppershall it is the entire parish. They are generally elected by the public every four years, but there are co-option spaces available on the Parish Council at the moment due to previous resignations.

What do councillors do?

Councillors have three main components to their work:

- Decision making Through meetings and attending committees with other elected members, councillors decide which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies should be implemented.
- Monitoring Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well things are working.
- 3. Getting involved locally As local representatives, councillors have responsibilities towards their constituents and local organisations. These responsibilities and duties often depend on what the councillor wants to achieve and how much time is available, and may include:
 - · Going to meetings of local organisations such as the Beds Police Priority Setting Meetings
 - · Reviewing planning applications
 - · Participating in litter picks
 - · Taking up issues on behalf of members of the public

How much time does it take up?

Quite often councillors say that their duties occupy them for about an hour a week. Obviously there are some councillors who spend more time than this - and some less, but in the main, being a, parish councillor is an enjoyable way of contributing to village life, and helping to make it a better place to live and work.

As a councillor representing the parish you will help keep it a great place to live and work. You will be supported in your role and will be expected to undertake training. You should be comfortable working electronically. You should have a positive outlook and a can-do attitude and be willing to work as part of a team.

Changes Approved For Schools For The Future Programme

Central Bedfordshire Council has approved changes to the Schools for the Future programme, aimed at providing greater clarity for schools and parents and supporting a fair and equitable approach across the whole of Central Bedfordshire.



Schools for the Future is an ambitious, long-term programme to raise education standards in Central Bedfordshire by ensuring the area has the right schools, in the right places, delivering the best education, and moving towards a two-tier educational system is part of achieving it.

The changes to the programme's principals and policies – approved by the Council's Executive (February 8) – were made in response to the authority adopting its Local Plan in July 2021, which sets out how Central Bedfordshire will develop over the next 20 years.

The Council used the opportunity to check the pupil places needed in future aligned to the new Local Plan, while acknowledging feedback from schools involved in the programme, which highlighted that schools would welcome more transparency and clarity about the parameters of the programme.

These new principles and policies include:

- Support for a target to improve learning outcomes to above the national average at Key Stage 2, Key Stage 4 and Post-16
- The council no longer making initial proposals for changes to academies, as they are not the key decision-maker. They will now welcome two-tier proposals from Academy Trusts, which are supported by the Department for Education.
- Proposals for two-tier conversion will be matched against Central Bedfordshire Council-validated pupil place requirements
- Schools for the Future capital investment will not support early years or post-16 proposals
- Proposals to improve and create SEND places will continue but SEND investment will be a parallel programme led by Children's Services and not directly managed by the Schools for the Future programme
- A new Design Principles Policy that sets out what can fairly and equitably be funded across the schools still in the three-tier system
- A new six-point criteria, which the council will consider all conversion proposals against

Cllr Sue Clark, Executive Member for Families, Education and Children, said: "Schools for the Future is now at a positive turning point, and with the new revised principles and policies that will underpin the programme, we can begin to work towards publishing an outline phasing plan for the new primary / secondary system in each area.

"The aim of this is to give all schools and parents the confidence that the programme will benefit all pupils in all the schools now looking forward to the new primary / secondary system.

"We believe the revised Schools for the Future principles and policies will provide clarity, transparency, affordability, and fairness to all schools who are partners in the programme. We are now very well placed to move forward at a quicker pace with the support of all our Schools for the Future partners."

Meppershall Pipeline Updates

Anglian Water has issued a further newsletter to local communities regarding the construction of the Meppershall Pipeline. This is a new 9KM that runs from the pumping station site between Flitton and Ampthill, just north of the A507, to the Anglian Water facility at the top of the hill down to Shillington just outside Meppershall. As previously covered in The Meppershall Messenger, it will be laid just south of Windmill Farm overlooking the view to Shillington, over open fields to the Cow Bridge and up the other side of the valley, north of Wassledine, to Campton Road in Upper Gravenhurst.

Enabling works are expected to commence in February or March including ecological protection measures and removal of vegetation in certain places. Work compounds are also expected to be set up, including a location in Meppershall on the road to Shillington opposite the water works. Another will be located north of Gravenhurst on the road to Campton – with a larger compound just off Clophill Road outside Gravenhurst.

Traffic controls, temporary signage, road closures and footpath diversions should be expected in certain places. The pipelaying itself is planned for Spring and Summer and the pipeline will be constructed west-to-east – meaning that pipelaying in Meppershall will come later in the overall project (summer).

By that time, remediation will be taking place along the route of the pipeline, including replacement of topsoil, restoration of access routes and fencing, reinstatement of road surfaces, reinstatement of drainage and replacement of vegetation. Where hedges and trees are removed, replacements will be made at the end of the project.

The pipeline forms part of wider strategic plans for new pipelines across the Anglian Water region, covering an area from Scunthorpe in the north, to Norwich and Ipswich in the east and Meppershall and Milton Keynes in the south and west. Together, the works aim to improve the network of pipes to provide more options for the supply of water across the region – improving the environmental impact of water extraction, assuring supplies and strengthening resilience to periods of drought. Depending on other works, the Meppershall Pipeline could be in use within the year. Protect your retirement from the risk of mental decline

Retirement – that magical time when we can finally live our lifelong dreams. Increased life expectancy means that many of us can now expect a longer retirement, but this comes at a cost: the increasing prevalence of age-related cognitive decline, which could leave us vulnerable to costly financial errors. According to the Alzheimer's Society, there are almost 885,000 people living with dementia in the UK, and estimates suggest that between 5% and 20% of over-65s suffer from mild cognitive impairment (MCI), a condition in which someone has minor problems with cognition, such as memory or thought process.

Protecting your finances

Planning for the possibility of cognitive decline is an essential part of preparing for retirement. Although many people still have the capacity to live independently and make decisions for themselves, MCI has been linked in scientific studies to poorer financial capacity and an increased susceptibility to scams.

Getting the timing right

Over 80% of investors surveyed8 thought the ideal time to transfer financial control would be 'sometime after they had begun to experience some cognitive decline but before they became completely incapable.' Respondents thought there was a higher than one-in-three chance of a mistimed transfer, partly attributable to a reluctance to relinquish control, which exemplifies the need to start planning sooner rather than later, so that any future transfer takes place on your terms.

Opening up conversations

Although it may feel awkward, preparing for the possibility of cognitive decline requires careful planning, not only having legal documents in place but also starting conversations with your family and those you trust about money and your goals for the future, in advance of its possible onset. This means that everything is out in the open and close connections are more likely to notice if you begin making decisions about your money that appear to contradict your objectives.

Plan ahead

Currently, Late Financial Bloomers account for just 6% of retirees, but this figure is set to rise significantly over the next 15 years. This shift towards later financial security means more people will face complex retirement journeys, thereby increasing the need to plan ahead.

Tackling pension scams head on

With pension scam losses totalling millions each year, the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) has reaffirmed its commitment to tackling scams in order to ensure the long-term health of the pensions market. In a speech to delegates at the Pensions and Lifetime Savings Association, the FCA's Executive Director of Markets Sarah Pritchard said steps have been taken to stop scams reaching consumers, "We want people to be better protected from the risks of scams and know how to protect themselves against them. Our ScamSmart campaign... gives knowledge and tools to help people protect themselves from scams." Simple steps We can all take simple steps to protect ourselves against potential scams.

These include:

- 1. Make sure you check who you're dealing with
- 2. Don't give out personal information you wouldn't share with a stranger
- 3. Don't feel pressurised into making quick decisions.

Good news – new measures. New regulations came into force on 30 November 2021 to protect pension savers and stop suspicious scam transfers, as pension trustees and scheme managers received new powers to intervene. Previously pension providers were not allowed to refuse to carry out a transfer where the saver has the right to do so, even if they were suspicious, but the new regulations will enable trustees to prevent a transfer request if they see evidence of 'red flags.'

THE ROUTE

On the 2nd Thursday of the month the W9 & W10 services go to St. Neots - a charming riverside market town in Cambridgeshire.

THE JOURNEY

The W9 picks-up at Shefford, Clifton, Henlow, Langford, Broom, Southill, Stanford and Caldecote, and the W10 pick-ups at Meppershall, Shillington, Stondon and Stotfold. I jumped on the bus at Stotfold at 9.45am and we were soon heading up the A1. Our driver today was Clive, and typical of Wanderbus drivers, he greeted me with a friendly smile.

Our drop-off point was Market Square in the town centre, arriving at around 10.15am, and the return bus departing at 12.15pm from the same place, as such, you have two hours to explore!

THE DESTINATION

The Wanderbus to St. Neots coincides with Market Day, so, my first port of call was to visit the market stalls. It's a good little market, with finshmongers, butchers, fruit and veg, bookstore, and clothes stalls.

The butcher's stall was basically a huge lorry, and the butcher was wired up with a microphone and public address system keeping things lively and entertaining. I purchased x5 packs of Dry Cured Oak Smoked Bacon for £5 (absolute bargain and the bacon was delicious). I also purchased two large packs of sausages. Great produce at fantastic prices.


