The arrival of spring in this part of the world is always magical. Our cover image may well have been inspired by a March scene in the churchyard - a wonderful watercolour painting by Arthur Sibun. We are very grateful for



the opportunity to include it here this month. Each season brings its own special pleasures but spring really does feel like a new start each year here in Meppershall.

The church message from Rector Roni (page 22) speaks of our chance to offer something back in return for the blessings and feel-good that Spring gives us. And it's the little things, isn't it? We can't all be famous leaders of great causes. But just a greeting to people on the street makes the world a little bit better. Each of us — and the places where we live — are at their best when we look upwards and outwards.

It's not just the birds that are in good voice. A new Community Choir has attracted huge participation with over a hundred voices at its first sessions in February, drawing a lot of Meppershall singers too. Meeting at St Michael's on 2nd, 16th and 30th March, you can find them on Facebook under "Shefford Community Choir".

Potholes remain a big theme for village chatter – there's lots more info in this issue and a plea to turn chatter into action by reporting pothole locations (see pages 13-14).

Crime also features prominently. Councillor Seaman is looking for anyone interested in supporting a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme (page 3) – particularly thinking of the new developments (there's a colour advert too). Thanks also to Joyce Harknett for compiling and sharing some excellent vehicle crime prevention advice (pages 3-5).

Meppershall still enjoys lower levels of crime than surrounding locations. In December one burglary, one vehicle offence and one violent offence were recorded. There were some 60 offences in the same period in Shefford (including 16 thefts from the vicinity of the Tesco Express), 18 in Clifton, 8 in Shillington.

Strong communities where we know each other, respect and appreciate our differences and contribute to the good of the community tend to be lower crime locations. One amazing way to start this spring is with the Meppershall Spring Clean (litter pick) on 18th March (page 19). A longer-term volunteering opportunity can be found on page 7 (Beds Fire & Rescue). Or maybe you'll just do your bit to make the verges and flower beds that bit more beautiful for you and your neighbours (pages 30-31). Community involvement seems to be on the up, which is great! The Meppershall Messenger itself has had some wonderful new offers of help—and we need more. The village pantomime earlier in the new year was well attended with lots of fun and audience participation (page 31). A small gang of helpers turned up to help remove the last security fencing around the newly opened Centenary Field. Now for the Coronation of HM King Charles III, and the Meppershall Village Fair on 1st July (the first in the new Village Hall and Centenary Field)... It is definitely spring time! Enjoy!







On behalf of Meppershall Parish Council I would like to welcome all new residents of Emery Gardens (new Bovis / Vistry Homes) and Woodlands Rest (Davidsons Homes) to our village. We hope that you enjoy our village life and all it has to offer.

The Parish Council constantly reviews crime rates in the village and we have noted that in the past few months there has been an increase in theft of vehicles and vehicle parts, not to mention an increase in anti-social behaviour.

As a village we have few options available to us to combat crime but it would be a great help to local residents and the village as a whole if someone would like to start up a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme in their own area e.g.: Emery Gardens and / or Woodlands Rest.

Belonging to a Neighbourhood Watch is about people getting together with their neighbours to take action to reduce crime. It is a community initiative owned and run by their members which work by developing a close relationship between community members and the local Police.

Neighbourhood Watch schemes can:

- Cut crime and the opportunities for crime
- Help and reassure those who live in the area
- Encourage neighbourliness and closer communities

Neighbourhood Watch Scheme can also have benefits including a reduction in some home insurance costs as well as a discount on ERA security products.

Dear Editor,

In the previous issue of the Messenger, it was reported that our crime rate had increased. I believe this is due to the amount of car crime now being committed - largely theft of vehicles outside our homes and catalytic converter theft. I have spent many a restless night lately worrying that something like this may happen to my family whilst we are all tucked up in bed, although I am aware that these crimes can also take place during the day.

I wonder if you would let me share a few handy tips to Meppershall residents on how to stay one step ahead of the criminals? We do have many residents that do not use the internet but will read their Messenger avidly and may find this useful.

Don't let thieves get an easy ride. Follow these simple rules to protect your vehicle from thieves and let's show them that Meppershall will not be their target area.

Keeping the keys safe

Vehicles today are generally more difficult to steal than ever, unless the thief can access your key or fob to clone them. Keep your keys safe, out of view when at home, and away from your front door. It's not uncommon for vehicle keys to be stolen from inside your home by thieves fishing for them through the letterbox.

Keyless entry

Vehicles with keyless entry unlock automatically when the key comes within a short distance of the vehicle. This can be from inside a pocket or bag. If you have to push a button on your vehicle key to open your vehicle, you don't have keyless entry.

Keyless vehicle theft or 'relay theft' is when a device is used to fool the vehicle into thinking the key is close by. This unlocks the vehicle and starts the ignition.

Thieves only need to be within a few metres of your vehicle key to capture the signal, even if it's inside your home. This means that even if your vehicle and home are secure, thieves can still unlock, start and steal your vehicle.

How to protect your keyless entry vehicle

When at home keep your vehicle key (and the spare) well away from the vehicle. Put the keys in a screened or signal-blocking pouch, such as a **Faraday Bag**. These can be purchased for **under £3 each** and will fit more than one set of keys. Reprogramme your keys if you buy a second-hand vehicle. Turn off wireless signals on your fob when it's not being used. It's always advisable to avoid parking in dark and secluded areas. It's worth an extra five or ten-minute walk if it means your vehicle is left in a well-lit and busier street.

Fit good in-vehicle security locks

Bear in mind that built-in steering locks aren't necessarily thief-proof. Many can be forced and broken. Fitting a steering wheel, gear lever or clutch pedal security device can give your vehicle added protection.

Catalytic converter theft

While hybrid vehicles are often targeted, vehicles that sit higher from the ground, such as SUVs and vans, are more likely to be stolen from too. The greater clearance under the vehicle makes their catalytic converter an easier target for thieves.

The Toyota Prius, Toyota Auris, Honda Jazz and the Honda CR-V are all top targets for thieves. It's believed that this is mostly due to the catalytic converter's location being easy to access.

Signs a catalytic converter theft is being committed

- A vehicle being raised using a jack in a car park or residential area
- A loud drilling or cutting sound coming from underneath the vehicle

Prevent it

Although catalytic converter thefts are increasing, there are steps that you can take to protect your vehicle. To keep your catalytic converter safe, you can ask your vehicle dealer for advice on locks or guards that are approved by the vehicle manufacturer and tested to Sold Secure Gold.

Where possible, park your vehicle in a locked garage.

If you don't have the luxury of off-street parking or you're not at home, you should park with the side of the vehicle closest to the catalytic converter near to a fence, wall, high kerb or other vehicles, and avoid mounting the pavement on two wheels. In most cases this is the side where your exhaust pipe is.

Catalytic converter thieves need to get under your vehicle to get a hold of their loot. You should make this as difficult as possible and give them limited space to use a jack and to slide beneath your vehicle to unscrew bolts or cut parts away using power tools.

Some brazen criminals will work in broad daylight, but parking in well-lit areas to prevent the thieves from working under the cover of darkness can help.

Lastly (and if the worse does happen) – Car Insurance

Make sure you comply with the overnight parking details you gave the Insurer at the time of purchasing cover. If you said the vehicle would be parked on the drive or in the garage – DO IT! Otherwise, any claim may be declined. I know only too well that it's so easy to pull up to the kerb and simply go indoors especially when it's cold or raining.

Meppershall Parish Council – Approved Summary of Minutes – 9th January 2023

Chairman's announcements

- Councillors were reminded of the Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) Topic Session on 23rd January 6-7pm via MS Teams. The topic covered will be Bedfordshire Employment and Skills Academy (BESA), which will detail their local offer. Anyone wishing to attend should respond to the correspondence circulation by the Clerk (clerk@meppershall-pc.gov.uk).
- CBC is also promoting a Carbon Literacy Awareness course on Thursday 26th January organised by Groundworks. Anyone wishing to attend should respond to the correspondence circulation by the Clerk.
- CBC have raised a motion in support of parish councillors, thanking them for the role they do in the community. NALC (National Association of Local Councils) has also issued a similar message.
- The crime statistics for Meppershall show 6 reported crimes which is a reduction from the previous month.

Public Session

Ward Councillors Brown and Liddiard provided an update on CBC activities:

- It is vitally important to retain the Fix My Street reference number for all reported issues as this helps Ward Councillors when requesting more clarity on decisions made by CBC officers.
- CBC 2023-2024 Budget proposals include:
 - No increase in CBC's share of the Council Tax
 - Fire (£5/annum), Police (£15/annum) and Parish Councils may choose to implement increases.
 - No cuts to any services are planned.
 - No change to 2-weekly collections of waste and free garden waste collections will re-start in April 2023.
 - Planned £9 million in efficiency savings.
 - o Capital Expenditure of £253 million is included in the proposed budget.
 - o An additional £5 million will be invested in Children's services.
 - An additional £1 million will be invested in leisure centres.
 - The proposed budget has a provision of £16 million for inflation costs.
- The contract to build Steppingley Crematorium has been awarded to Spacemaker Developments Ltd, with an 18 month delivery date.
- Ward Councillors have allocated their Community Grant allocation to the Warm Homes programme set up by Shefford Town Council. This will provide for any residents in the ward who need help during this winter. Sites include Shefford Town Memorial Association (STMA), all churches, Library, Shefford Town Council Office.
- CBC has allocated £1.4 million to support vulnerable residents, the continuation of provision of free school meals and funding for local foodbanks.
- Funding of up to £10k is available for eligible residents to make their homes more energy efficient. See:

- CBC has set up a crisis fund for children's centres. £45k has been set aside for hardship payments to residents who are referred to the NEED project.
- The CBC recycling team have a number of videos on YouTube focussing on what can and cannot be recycled.
- CBC is starting to install EV Charging Points and a bike repair stop is up and running in Shefford.
- CBC is bidding for 'Pocket Parks' funding and wish to develop a site in Shefford off Ivel Road into a small forest / park.
- There are still tree planting grants available from CBC and Ward Councillors still have match funding available for any local community projects.

Questions / comments from the public:

- Potholes on Shefford Road and other village roads are now too numerous, becoming dangerous, some residents making claims against CBC for damages. What can Ward Councillors do to help get them patched or the road resurfaced? The Clerk advised that Mrs Thorne has now walked the village and photographed all the potholes she could find in order to log then on Fix-My-Street. ML & AB advised that they would contact Highways Officers with photos provided by Mrs Thorne and request that patching is carried out as soon as possible. The Clerk will be updated on progress made. Council agreed that the Clerk should produce an article for the Messenger to communicate the plan on re-surfacing of Shefford Road, how residents can help with reporting potholes and what to do if a pothole damages their vehicle.
- Vehicles continue to use the Hoo Road bridleway as a cut through from Shefford Road to Chapel Road. Many vehicles end up trying to turn in the entrance to Old Road Meadow and have caused damage to the gate that is now unrepairable. Signage is not adequate. What can be done to help resolve this issue before someone is hurt? The Clerk advised that the CBC ROW (Rights of Way) Officer is working towards the installation of a horse gate on the bridleway to stop traffic using it however this will not stop vehicles accessing via Shefford Road or Chapel Road. ML to discuss issue with CBC Highways Officers. MPC to investigate road signage that makes reference to not following Sat Nav directions.

Procedures, Consultations and Legal:

- **a. Meeting dates 2023-2024** Resolved that MPC approves the 2023-2024 meetings as amended during the meeting. Carried.
- **b. Consultations -** CBC Budget 2023 consultation *Councillors noted that no increase was planned in CBC's share of the Council tax and agreed that councillors should respond to the consultation as individuals.*
- **c. IT and Communications -** Website usage continues to rise. The MPC Dog Fouling campaign is creating chatter on Facebook.
- **d.** Stocken House Green Space MPC (Meppershall Parish Council) Solicitor is chasing Davidson's for a copy of the final Agreement for MPC approval and signing in addition to confirmation that CBC have approved MPC's adoption of the green space.

e. Wry Close Allotment Track – The Clerk advised that the utility company representatives have advised that MPC land is no longer required for the gas installation at the Sugar Loaf PH as an alternative supply route had been found.

Finance:

a. Purchase Orders - Resolved to approve cost of 6 x 'sturdy' bollards as approved by the Clerk and Cllr Thompson, purchase of signage as required by, installation of signage, noticeboards and bollards, wildflowers for Old Road Meadow up to £500.

b. Document approval

 Resolved to approve Bank Statements & Reconciliations Current Account 166, 167 & 168, Bank Statements and Reconciliations Savings Account 037 & 038 and MultiPay Card Statements and Reconciliations November to December 2022.

c. Orders for the payment of money

i. Council resolved that the schedule of payments as presented be approved and authorised for payment by Councillor Thompson.

d. 2023-2024 budget

i. Grant applications:

- 1. Resolved to approve a grant request from the Meppershall Events Committee for £1,500 for the 2023-2024 financial year payable in April 2023 (Local Government Act 1972, s.145.1.a).
- 2. Resolved to approve a grant request from the Meppershall Messenger for £750 for the 2023-2024 financial year payable in April 2023 (Local Government Act 1972, s.142).
- ii. Celebration of King's Coronation and any budget required Councillors discussed how MPC and the village may wish to celebrate the King's Coronation in May whilst recognising that MPC does not have the means to organise an event on their own. The Clerk was asked to look at the cost of providing children in Meppershall schools with a gift and to set aside a sum of £1,500 in the 2023-2024 budget for Coronation event spend.
- iii. Annual maintenance of gym equipment Resolved to approve Maintenance Service Agreement with Fresh Air Fitness for 2023-2024 subsequent to Clerk assessing other similar quotations and option to cost share with Gravenhurst Parish Council (Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976, s.19).
- e. 2023-2024 Precept Deferred to Extra-Ordinary meeting to be held on Monday 16th January at 10am in the Village Hall.

Planning and Housing:

a. Planning applications for consideration

i. CB/22/04621/FULL - Land at Hoo Farm, Chapel Road - Change of use from a caravan storage area to an area for general B8 storage. Resolved that the Council objects to planning application 22/04621 on the grounds of highways issues, health and safety and character and landscape, and that a request be made for the removal of permitted development rights if the planning application is approved.

- ii. CB/22/04655/FULL 11 Coneygate, SG17 5GB Proposed single storey infill extension and first floor rear extension. *Resolved that the Council has no comment on planning application 22/04655*.
- iii. CB/TRE/22/00658 84 Shefford Road, SG17 5LL Works to a tree protected by a Tree Preservation Order: (MB/99/00008/T1) Quercus Robur (English Oak) 25% reduction of canopy, shape & balance crown where appropriate. Crown lift to 5m over carriageway. Removal of all deadwood within canopy (T1). Resolved that the Council objects to planning application TRE/22/00658 due to concerns regarding the extent of the proposed works and the effect they will have on the Oak Tree if they are all conducted at the same time.
- b. Update on applications responded to by the Clerk using delegated powers. CB/22/04178/FULL - The Pigling, Shefford Road, SG17 5LL - Erection of a detached dwelling, a detached double garage, a detached single garage with a store/workshop and parking. The Clerk submitted an objection based on character and appearance of the site, noise and disturbance and lack of consultation with neighbours. A request for conditions to be included on permitted development rights was included should CBC be minded to grant the planning application.

Neighbourhood Plan:

The draft Neighbourhood Plan (NP) has been updated and requires a clarification on a number of points before we can proceed to the next stage.

Highways and Transport:

- a. OPCC and RMF grant funding update Gateway, VAS and 40mph buffer installation planned for 2nd December but date changed to January 9th start. Confirmation received from the PCC that the funding commitment will continue, despite the delays to deliver the scheme.
- **b.** Participation in Pan-Bedfordshire Bus Users' Forum Resolved that the Council link into this initiative via the Meppershall Wanderbus.
- c. Proposal for road safety improvements on new developments Councillor Seaman proposed approaching developers of sites in Meppershall, namely Bovis and Davidsons Homes to see if they would be willing to erect 20mph signage within their sites to assist with road safety as Croudace Homes have done in Walnut tree Way. Resolved Councillor Seaman approach developers of new sites in Meppershall regarding 20mph zones on their sites. Carried.

Environment and Leisure:

a. Centenary Field

- i. Update on drainage and landscaping works The Clerk reported that Sherriffs have completed all their works except verti-draining and over seeding of the outfield which will be completed by Sherriffs in the spring. Mrs Thorne provided positive feedback on the grass within the fenced off area and suggested that the heras fencing could be removed. Councillors agreed that the Clerk and Mrs Thorne would organise a working party one weekend before the school half term pending good weather conditions to remove all the heras fencing.
- ii. Update on gym installation The Clerk reported that the metal labels have now all been fitted and no other installation snagging is outstanding.

- **b. Update on allotment renewals** The Clerk advised that circa £600 is still due in allotment rent and that she is chasing this.
- c. Update on Dog Fouling campaign The Clerk advised that the dog fouling campaign is going well with Facebook posts now starting to instigate online chatter about the issue. Our request for more dog bins is pending as is signage. The Dog Wardens are visiting the village more frequently. A local resident is leaving dog poo bags for others to use attached to the pitch fencing. Resolved to purchase dog poo bags and dispensers up to £50 (Litter Act 1983, ss.5-6).

Close of the meeting - The Chairman closed the meeting at 9:25pm and reminded everyone that the next meeting would be the extra-ordinary meeting on 16th January 2023, and the ordinary meeting on 23rd February starting at 7pm in the Village Hall.

Meppershall Parish Council – Approved Summary of Minutes – 16th January 2023

Finance:

a. To review and approve 2023-2024 Budget.

The Clerk and Councillors reviewed:

- The current financial year actual and forecasted income and expenditure report prepared by the Clerk in order to confirm predicted end of year general reserves (carry forward).
- Earmarked reserves both current year and the recommended start position for 2023-2024.
- The proposed 2023-2024 budget as prepared by the Clerk.

 Amendments were made to the budget in the meeting as the line by line review took place.

Resolved to approve the 2023-2024 budget as amended.

b. To review and approve 2023-2024 Precept request.

The Clerk and Councillors reviewed a number of 2023-2024 precept options and based upon the approved budget discussed the merits of each option and the impact on both general and earmarked reserves. Councillors recognised that the predicted 2023-2024 general reserves would be lower than in previous years but it was hoped that some in year savings could be found and that the Earmarked contingency would not be required. Resolved to approve and to set a precept of £65,461 which equates to Band D Council Tax charge of £64.43 (increase of 3.00% or £1.88 on 2022-2023). The Clerk was also asked to write an article for the Messenger.

Parish Council Precept

In addition to the Police, Fire Services and Central Bedfordshire Council, our Parish Council receives money from your council tax bills. This is called the precept.

At the Parish Council meeting on Monday 16th January, Meppershall Parish Council agreed to request a precept of £65,461 for the financial year 2023-2024 to be raised

through council tax payments from all the dwellings within the parish area to help support parish council services and activities.

This is an increase of 3.00% compared to the previous financial year's contribution. Using a Band D Council Tax dwelling as an example, this is a £1.88 increase over the whole year. In 2023-2024 the annual contribution per Band D dwelling will be £64.43.

In the financial year April 2023 to March 2024 we expect to have completed projects initiated in 2022 at Centenary Field and Old Road Meadow. However in 2023 we will be working on the following:

- £3,000 on visual display boards at Centenary Field and Old Road Meadow
- £11,500 on allotment renovations (deferred from previous year)
- £2,000 on a new defib to be installed at the Care Home for all residents to access
- £3,000 on new trees

There are general running costs of the village too, including grass cutting, environmental maintenance of areas including Old Road Meadow, allotments as well as other expenses.

As always Councillors have looked carefully at what is needed in order to keep any increase to a minimum, and to ensure that the reserves are sufficient to cover any unforeseen expenses as well as the agreed level of running costs.

We will continue to make use of grant applications and funds secured from developers to support our expenditure.

Central Bedfordshire Council: Fixing Potholes Across Central Bedfordshire

A recent update from CBC regarding the issue on everyone's minds...

"We're continuing to fix potholes in the roads as the cold, icy weather plays havoc with road surfaces.

"Freezing conditions before Christmas and into the New Year, combined with



periods of prolonged rain, have seen roads suffer in all parts of the UK, with potholes and defects appearing in carriageways.

"In Central Bedfordshire, since the start of April 2022, around 2,000 potholes have been repaired as we work hard to maintain over 800 miles of roads. In addition to our

funding, £2.5million from the Department for Transport's Pothole Fund is helping with this work.

"To step up work on repairing the potholes, cutting-edge technology will also be deployed in the form of four Jetpatcher machines. This road repair system leads to safe repairs, reduces costs and takes only half the time to fix potholes when compared to traditional repair methods. This will enable us to reduce the pothole backlog and minimise disruption for road users and residents during the work.


"We're also investing £20 million in the highways network in the 2022/23 financial year and have over 200 improvement schemes in our Highways Annual Plan for this same period, of which 80% have already been completed.


"If residents notice any issues on our road network, they are asked to report them on Fix My Street so we can investigate the problem further.

"In an emergency, dangerous potholes or other safetyrelated issues can be reported to our highways 24 hour emergency team on 0300 300 8049."

Know Your Village Potholes

For months now residents and those using our village roads have put up a courageous battle navigating





The depth of the pothole problem has reached an alltime low in Meppershall. So much SO that at the beginning of January parish council staff walked all our streets and logged each pothole found with photos and measurements on the Central Bedfordshire Council Fix My Street website that alerts them to problems on the highways. The image what here shows was logged. Our Ward Councillors this have



information and are pushing CBC to get patching crews out as soon as possible. These will be temporary repairs due to current wet and icy conditions.

So why not resurface Shefford Road? The Parish Council understands that the cost to re-surface Shefford Road could be close to £250k. Construction of new dwellings and approved road improvements are yet to be completed along Shefford Road and it is highly unlikely that CBC will spend money on resurfacing until they are. That said we are putting pressure on them to do what they can to alleviate the problem.

So what can you do to help? If you see a new pothole or any other highway problem please log it on Fix My Street:

https://fixmystreet.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/ If you don't log it then CBC don't know it's there and can't arrange to fix it.

Make a careful note of the Fix My Street reference number when you log the pothole on the system. That number is a unique case reference which can be used to track what happens to your report and what action is taken.

How do I make a claim against Central Bedfordshire Council for damage to my car? If you are unlucky enough to have suffered damage to your vehicle due to potholes, you can ring the Council on 0300 300 8049 to make a claim. Just be aware that damage alone does not mean you are guaranteed to receive compensation. The Council may be able to claim that it wasn't aware of the pothole or they had taken appropriate actions.

Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) News

Improvements at the Flying Horse roundabout on the A507 west of Meppershall

Work will soon start on a redesigned Clophill roundabout improvement scheme. The contractor, Octavius, will be on site from Monday 20th February. Construction costs have risen significantly since the original budget for the work was set in May 2021 (before construction costs soared). This has created a further opportunity to reassess the plans, redesign the roundabout and further address public concerns.

The amended scheme retains the footbridge as well as the existing A6 bridge over River Flit. The length of new dual-lane approach sections on the A6 south of the Flying Horse and A507 east will also be shorter. This remodelling will bring costs back in line with the budget while, according to CBC, still delivering benefits for road users, local residents, and communities across Central Bedfordshire. Enhanced roundabout capacity will allow more vehicles through the junction at the same time.

CBC says the improvements will reduce journey times, apart from eastbound journeys on the A507 at peak travel times in the evening and northbound journeys on the A6 in the morning peak travel period (because of the shorter dual-lane sections and retained bridges). The scheme also includes 30mph speed limits on the approaches to the roundabout and three new toucan crossings (north, south and west – with the footbridge retained on the eastern arm).

CBC's Principal Project Manager Trish Etheridge said: "The scheme supports the future of Central Bedfordshire by building much-needed extra capacity at this busy junction which will see more traffic in the future, particularly with the planned M1/A6 link road." The scheme is backed by £6.8 million of government "Levelling Up" funding. Read more at www.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/clophill.





March For Men's Health!

March is Prostate Cancer Awareness Month

Prostate Cancer is the most common cancer in men. 1 in 8 men will get prostate cancer and if you're over 50, or you're black, or have a family history of prostate cancer the risk is increased. 1 in 4 black or mixed black males aged over 45 will have prostate cancer in their lifetime.

Most men with early prostate cancer do not experience any symptoms. If you do notice changes in the way you urinate, this is more likely to be a sign of a very common non-cancerous problem called an enlarged prostate, or another health problem. But it is still a good idea to get it checked out. Possible symptoms include:

- Difficulty starting to urinate or emptying your bladder
- A weak flow when you urinate
- A feeling that your bladder hasn't emptied properly
- Dribbling urine after you finish urinating
- Needing to urinate more often than usual, especially at night
- A sudden need to urinate

The prostate is a gland at the base of the bladder. It is about the size of a walnut but gets bigger as men get older.

The prostate gland produces a protein called prostate specific antigen (PSA). A blood test can measure the level of PSA.

Prostate cancer is not always life-threatening and when cancer is spotted early, treatment is more likely to be successful. Thanks to research, treatments are kinder and more effective than ever.

In the event of someone collapsing or needing emergency medical help, dial 999 immediately.

If a defibrillator is required, the 999 operator will instruct you on what to do — including CPR if needed — while asking someone else to get a defibrillator. The 999 call handler will provide details of the nearest defibrillator, plus the code to access it.





Message from St Mary's...

On Wednesday 22nd February we began our Lenten pilgrimage to Easter. The point of all pilgrimages is not just to arrive at the destination, but also to be changed on the journey.

The most popular question at this time is: What are you giving up for Lent?

People usually say something like - alcohol, chocolate, biscuits, cake, TV... and of course, there may be benefit in giving up or cutting down on some of those things!

But this year why not make a conscious effort to draw closer to God day by day. We were, each of us, made in the image and likeness of God and the point of this pilgrimage, not just through Lent but through life, is to recapture the image and likeness in which we were made... to be transformed... to be "changed from glory into glory, till in heaven we take our place" (as the hymn Love Divine says).

So how can we draw closer to God?

Firstly by making time and space for God - in the same way that if we were trying to draw closer to another human person we would make time and space for them. (Giving up some TV might help!)

Then taking time to pray... To praise and worship and adore, to be thankful, to be sorry or repentant, to intercede for the church and its leaders, the world and its leaders, for our local communities - our friends and neighbours - for whatever we feel "led" to pray for.

I know that many of you read your Bibles regularly - but Lent might be a good time (for some of us!) to spend more time with our Bibles - maybe making time to read the whole of Matthew's (this year's) Gospel, or to focus on one favourite psalm a week, maybe psalm 23, psalm 91, psalm 121, psalm 139 for example.

The Church of England is offering us "Dust and Glory" for Lent. Dust and Glory's daily meditations encourage us to take a fresh look at the frustrations and failings that every day brings, seek to learn from them and grow closer to God through them. The App is available now to download for free - just Google Church of England - Dust and Glory. Some paper copies are available in the Church for those without the technology!

Because Lent isn't just for praying and thinking - but is also for doing...

An accompanying children's version is also available to help children and their families explore how we can live well together, offering a simple daily activity designed to explore the weekly themes.

As a family though, you might also like to devise your own "40 activities for Lent". There are lots of examples online to give you ideas!

Sometimes it great gifts and grand gestures that change the world - the discovery of germs and antibiotics, brave men and women working in blue light organisations. Mother Teresa simply gathered abandoned babies and dying adults to live or die in peace and comfort - and you might be thinking that will never be me! But sometimes small acts of love or appropriate defiance can change the world too. Trevor Huddleston, who was a white English priest who had gone to work in South Africa because he was appalled at the injustice of apartheid, doffed his hat and smiled and said "Good Morning" to Desmond Tutu's mother and from that moment the boy decided to find out about Trevor Huddleston's God - and the rest, as they say, is history. Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat in the coloured section of the bus to a white person and "accidentally" became a famous symbol of resistance to racial segregation. Think too, of the press reaction when Princess Diana shook the hand of the man with HIV, of those who quietly make gowns for still born babies, those who look after a neighbour in need, or who regularly give to a food bank. It is possible to quietly change the world for the better.

And there are plenty of hugely deserving causes at this time inviting us to be generous, and use some of our money to help others: locally, the Need Project of course, and across the world Syria and Turkey, Yemen and so many other places and different needs supported by charities of many shapes and sizes.

We all know that most of the time we are not perfect. Time after time we need to pause, take stock, re-evaluate who we are choosing to be and how we are choosing to live. Lent is just one particular invitation - to pick ourselves up, brush ourselves down, turn around and start all over again!

Lent is an invitation to journey through 7 weeks thoughtfully, prayerfully, actively, so that we arrive at Easter loving God and our neighbour just a little bit more and shining a bit more brightly in the world to the glory of God.

Financial Fitness: Building Retirement Resilience By Paul Savuto

Although there are many challenges on the household finance front at the moment, the new tax year always provides the perfect opportunity for a financial health check; and a key element of any finance MOT will inevitably be an honest appraisal of your financial fitness for life after work.

Retirement income targets

The introduction of auto enrolment ten years ago was a big advance in normalising workplace pension provision. However, it has not translated into true pension engagement. Many just 'set and forget' - still unsure how much they actually need to save; and relying solely on auto enrolment contributions will not guarantee a comfortable, let alone luxurious, retirement.

Whatever your age, retirement planning needs to be on your financial radar, as starting to save at the earliest opportunity provides the best chance of accumulating a pension pot capable of funding the retirement you deserve.

Family finances: It's good to talk

New research suggests young adults and their parents are becoming increasingly comfortable talking about money matters, which should ensure future generations are much better equipped to tackle their financial affairs.

Breaking the taboo

Historically, intergenerational discussions about finances have too often been viewed as a no-go area, but the research suggests UK families are beginning to open up, with young adults significantly more likely to have talked to their parents about the issue than previous generations. In total, three out of four 18 to 24-year-olds said they spoke with their parents about money matters when they were growing up; this compares to just four in ten over-65s and half of 55 to 64-year-olds.

Reaping the rewards

Experts have long advocated the benefits of families talking openly about financial affairs. Parents who do so are more likely to ensure their children are better prepared to deal with money matters when they reach adulthood, whether in relation to day-to-day spending issues or the need to develop longer-term savings habits.

Young wealth owners

The need for young adults to be financially savvy has perhaps never been greater, with a growing proportion of this generation now owning a considerable amount of wealth. Indeed, estimates suggest the number of UK Millennial and Generation Z millionaires has doubled over the past year and now stands at a record high of 2,000.

Keep talking

An increasing desire for families to discuss financial affairs is definitely a positive trend which should help the next generation realise the value of money and establish good financial habits at a young age. So, keep the conversations going to help secure your children's financial futures.

Take control now to beat the tax chill

Following his controversial 'stealth tax' Statement in November, the Chancellor made a raft of key personal taxation and pension announcements.

The government pledged its commitment to the pensions Triple Lock, which will increase the State Pension in line with September's Consumer Prices Index (CPI) rate of 10.1%. This means that the value of the basic State Pension will increase in April 2023 from £141.85 per week to £156.20 per week, while the full new State Pension will rise from £185.15 to £203.85 per week.

Then came some 'stealth' announcements set to pull people into paying higher rates of tax, more people paying IHT, a cut to tax-free earnings from dividends and a reduction in CGT allowances. In addition to the Dividend Allowance and CGT allowance reductions and IHT freeze, other key personal tax announcements included:

- The Income Tax additional rate threshold (ART) at which 45p becomes payable will be lowered from £150,000 to £125,140 from 6 April 2023. The ART for non-savings and non-dividend income will apply to taxpayers in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. The ART for savings and dividend income will apply UK-wide. This move is set to push 250,000 more people into this band
- The Income Tax Personal Allowance and higher rate threshold are to remain at current levels – £12,570 and £50,270 respectively – until April 2028 (rates and thresholds may differ for taxpayers in parts of the UK where Income Tax is devolved).

With an increasing number of people likely to be impacted by these changes, we can't stress enough the importance of tax year end planning. Although some of these changes don't come in with immediate effect, it is vital to ensure you are in the best place possible to take advantage of any allowances, exemptions and reliefs available this year and to prepare for the changes that come in over the next few years. With plenty to consider and factor into your financial plan, valuable financial advice remains central to achieving your goals and aspirations.

Trugs and Trowels Gardening Club (Campton)

Here we are halfway through February and this pre-spring sunshine means we can get a head start on the winter clear up — especially if like me you will be cutting down all the dead leaves and shrubbery along with plants lost in the harsh frosty spells. There are lots of jobs to be getting on with in your gardens and green houses.

Preparing beds for spring: This is one of the most important jobs. Digging over will aerate, drain and warm the soil. Incorporate plenty of homemade compost or composted manure. Alternatively give the beds a dressing of organic matter then cover them in plastic for a few weeks to reduce weeds and warm the soil.

If planting yourself some rhubarb: Keep the buds of the crown level with the soil.

Five good seeds to sow in February (flowers and vegetables): These can help you extend the season by repeat sowing. All you need is a sunny window sill or a propagator. Our top five include: cosmos which always look great in borders; kale - a lovely leafy green vegetable; sweet peas - remembering to soak your seeds overnight; tomatoes which germinate within two weeks (a variety is good to include tumbling for your hanging baskets); salvia which bring structure and height.

Top tips for successful propagation: Always maintain good light and air levels; use fresh compost mixed with perlite; water the growing plants via trays below the pots; ensure good ventilation during the day.

Cutting back: Time to cut back late flowering clematis and any wisteria sideshoots to three buds; trim back ivy and Virginia creepers. Prune buddleia and elder to the base. Split herbaceous perennials; divide winter aconites; also split snowdrops when they have stopped flowering.

Feed: Sprinkle slow release fertilisers around the base of roses; feed fruit trees and bushes with a sprinkling of sulphate and potash.

On 6th March we have an equally exciting speaker as Martin, the owner of cottage farm nurseries in Cardington, will be joining us to deliver a very knowledgeable insight to gardening along with a question session. One not to be missed.

All welcome at our 6th March meeting: 7.30pm, £3.50 non-members. Refreshments, raffle and free 'swap table'.



March Madness By Donna Cameron

March is a busy time of year in the garden. Daffodils are out in abundance, spreading their springtime joy, and the worst of the weather is hopefully behind us.

I have been enjoying my lunchtimes out in the garden, planning what to grow this year, whilst the heady scent of Sarcococca confusa fills the air.

This plant is a must in the garden, also known as Christmas Box. It has evergreen leaves and the most heavenly scented delicate, tiny white

flowers running up the stems, followed by black berries. I first encountered it at RHS Wisley one winter where they had made a hedge with it. It is divine!

One of the most important jobs you can do is to prepare the soil my mulching it by adding compost or manure. This improves the soil structure, locks in moisture and suppresses the weeds. Top dress pots by removing any weeds or moss and adding some compost. Mulch Roses with manure around the base to give them a boost and ensure a great floral display in June.

The days are lengthening and the warm rays of the sun means that growth is accelerating quickly and the soil is warming up ready to plant. Some things can be planted directly, such as broad beans and some hardy annuals. Others can be planted in seed trays under glass. Dahlia tubers can be planted up in a multi-purpose compost to be planted out end of May.

It is a great time to reseed any bare patches on your lawn. Lightly rake, add some lawn compost and seed and water. You may have to cover from hungry pigeons! And don't allow to dry out.

Enjoy the garden inside too. Pick bunches of Daffodils, Grape Hyacinths and branches of blossom.

So enjoy your gardens and get planting!
