





Raffle – no Summer Fair would be complete without a chance to win something. We have some fantastic prizes lined up and we'd love to see you take them home


Classic Cars – we are so excited that we will be able to host a raft of classic cars from the village and beyond. A big thank you to Jean Holden for organising

Meppershall Summer Fair - Bake Off is Back!

With the relaunch of our wonderful Village Fair comes exciting news in as much as the very popular Meppershall Bake Off, is back!

This event has always been hugely popular and we're delighted to enlist the help, once again, of our friends at the Women's Institute who will be judging the entries. You simply couldn't get much better than that, given their wealth of experience and tremendous knowledge in all things baking.

What to Expect...

The whole idea of the Bake Off is to get people of all ages baking. A little bit of friendly competition is thrown in for good measure and it's always a pleasure to go and see the entries at the Bake Off Marquee when the Fair opens – regardless of whether you have entered or not

I have listed the categories and classes next – broken down across Cakes, Bread, Mini Baker etc. with a range of options within each class. A Bake Off wouldn't be a Bake Off if we didn't have a Show Stopper and this year we're going with the theme of 'Kings Coronation' which will need to comprise a minimum of a 3 layer sponge – decorated as extravagantly as you can - with points awarded equally between taste and presentation!

The 'Technical Bake' is something a bit different and here I'm trying to raise the profile of one of Bedfordshire's oldest baking traditions – the Bedfordshire Clanger! Look it up - this is an amazing cross between a pasty and a sweet pie...

Set recipes are just that – there will be a Bake Off booklet posted on the Meppershall FB pages with a few hard copies going in the Village shop too for anyone who doesn't have access to FB. In here will be set recipes for the Victoria Sponge and Lemon Drizzle – you cannot deviate away from the recipe provided and this allows your true baking prowess to come through when it comes to judging.

The Bake Off booklet will also have entry forms – you can enter as many categories as you like, sticking to any associated rules around age etc. Entries can be printed and submitted or completed and emailed to me prior to the event. (Full details in booklet).

Your entry will need to be brought to the Fair first thing in the morning of the Fair itself. Judging will take place behind closed doors prior to the Fair opening, and you can come and see how well you have done once the Fair opens - as well as looking at all of the other entries.

This has always been a really popular event and I hope you feel suitably inspired to enter...





Meppershall Parish Council: Summary of Minutes 17th April 2023

Ordinary Meeting of Meppershall Parish Council (MPC) on Monday 17th April 2023.

Chairman's announcements

- The crime statistic for Meppershall show 6 reported crimes for last month, one a burglary.
- Beds Police were patrolling in Meppershall yesterday.
- On behalf of the Parish Council, the Chairman noted that this is the last time
 that Ward Councillors Brown and Liddiard will be at the Parish Council meeting
 as our elected representatives. We will miss them and wish them well for the
 future, hopefully working within a new ward. The Chairman expressed sincere
 thanks for all their help and assistance over the past years and we are deeply
 grateful for all they have done for us. The Parish Council looks forward to
 meeting our new Ward Councillor in May who will have difficulty in filling their
 shoes.
- On behalf of Councillors, the Clerk and Mrs Thorne, the Chairman wished to thank councillors who have chosen to stand down from their seats in May, namely Councillors Crossley and Chapman. In particular, a huge thank you and our heartfelt best wishes go to Councillor Peter Chapman who leaves the Council after 32 years of service, many of which were as Chairman of the Parish Council. All present gave a round of applause.

Public Session - CBC Ward Councillors Liddiard and Brown provided an update on Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) activities:

- Shefford Road VAS Despite assurances that the missing VAS would finally be installed on 14th April, it is still not in situ. Councillor Brown will chase CBC for installation details and will follow through on this matter until resolved even if not representing Meppershall after the May elections.
- CBC Highways Two new Highways Officers have been employed. Adam Shortland is our Highways Technician / Inspector and Scott Terry is our new Principle Highways Officer who reports to Nick Carofalo. Scott Terry has visited Meppershall with our Ward Councillors to see first-hand highways issues.
- Potholes CBC now has six teams repairing potholes. A team has been allocated to Meppershall, Shefford and Stotfold and they should be in the village at some point this week. Repairs are now permanent repairs.
- Voting A reminder that photo ID is required when voting in person for the upcoming May elections. Voters who wish to vote but do not have photo ID will be turned away.
- Leisure Centres A new leisure operator covering all CBC leisure centres and theatres started on 1st April. Councillor Liddiard has been in contact with two Meppershall residents with regards to the booking system for swimming at Flitwick Leisure Centre. Pool users must now reserve swimming slots in advance.
- Supplementary Planning Guidance The consultation has now finished and CBC will be looking to adopt the ne guidance shortly.

• Finally, Cllr Liddiard thanked the Parish Council. Working with a parish council that supports village infrastructure and aspirations, and also works in partnership with other councils has been both enjoyable and a pleasure.

Questions / comments from the public

- Where will the Meppershall polling station be located? It was assumed this would be the Village Hall.
- The horse gate has been installed at the Chapel Road end of the Hoo Road bridleway, is MPC organising signage to stop vehicular access at the High Street end? Yes, this is in progress.
- Family swimming at CBC leisure centres is restricted for school age children and capacity is limited. This is not conducive to learning. What can be done to reduce restrictions? ML is discussing this with CBC Leisure Officers. There is also discussion concerning a completely digitised system that excludes some members of society.

Procedures, Consultations and Legal

- **a. Procedures** Resolved to approve MPC Protocol for Marking the Death of a Senior National Figure or Local Holder of High Office v2.0.
- **b. IT and Communications** A report on website usage was circulated to councillors at the beginning of the month. Amendments will be made to the MPC website after the May 2023 elections.
- **c. Stocken House Green Space** Update from Clerk and Cllr Thompson on Agreement including formal request made to confirm with our solicitor that the agreement and transfer documents are acceptable.
- **d. MPC Crackle Hill Track / Driveway -** To receive update on works carried out by Anglian Water to remove non-authorised utilities from MPC land and agree on any actions required.
 - Anglian Water were to visit site and carry out remedial works between 12th to 14th April. Permissive path closure signs were erected and notices posted on social media. Works have not been completed within timescales due to broken parts. Upon inspection on 17th April the Clerk found that utilities for water have not been moved with only the positioning of meters changed. The Clerk has contacted Anglian Water and asked them to come back and move the water line, meters and stopcock as agreed.

Finance

a. Purchase orders

Cllr Thompson did not participate in agenda items 893.a.ii having previously declared an interest. Cllr Chapman took over as Chairman of the meeting for this agenda item.

- Resolved that Mrs Thorne undertake Level 1 Grounds Maintenance training at cost of £42+VAT.
- ii. Resolved to purchase and donate television to MVH at cost of £565.83 +VAT (Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 s.19).
- iii. Resolved to purchase coronation mugs for distribution to village school children and other residents at cost of £1097+VAT (Local Government Act 1972, s.137).

iv. Resolved to purchase gym equipment spares and maintenance items, cordless palm sander, cordless drill and a set of tools.

b. Grant applications

- i. Resolved to approve grant funding of £500 for CPRE Bedfordshire (Local Government Act 1972, s.137).
- ii. Resolved to approve grant funding of £500 for Meppershall Social Club (Local Government Act 1972, s.137).
- **c. Document approval** Resolved to approve Bank Statements & Reconciliations Current Account 172, Bank Statements and Reconciliations Savings Account 041.
- **d. Orders for the payment of money** Resolved that the schedules of payments as presented be approved and authorised for payment by Councillor Thompson and or Councillor Parsons. Carried.

A Visit To South Sudan by Andrew Goodman

Revd. Andrew Goodman, husband of Roni Goodman, Rector of St Mary's Church Meppershall, recently made a trip to South Sudan and we are grateful for his story here. Thank you Andrew for this hopeful and inspiring account of wonderful people and faith in a country with so many challenges at the present time.

In January I visited South Sudan, the youngest, most underdeveloped country in the world, to help lead a conference in the far north, by the Ethiopian border in Maiwut. Our team was invited by Bishop Peter Gatbel.

Coordinator John Jamuth explains: "Gaining independence in 2011 brought more freedom of worship, fellowship and discipleship to entire Christian populations in South Sudan. Maiwut diocese was born as the result of freedom of religious expression and worship. It's one of the youngest Dioceses in the Province of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan. Because of its location the Diocese has very limited connection with international partners to support the ministry and development of the diocese."



This is an understatement. In fact, Maiwut has no transport infrastructure and is so remote that the old American Red Cross base where I stayed has a dirt airstrip alongside for their weekly supply aircraft landing. The strip is swept and cleared of wandering cattle by the schoolchildren. There are no church or charity partners except for the one we stayed with at the base. The ended war last year, but government destroyed the schools and churches to prevent rebels sheltering in them, so the people are at ground zero.

Our team were only the second outside visitors since 2014 when the diocese (district under the pastoral care of a Bishop) started. We arrived in pitch darkness after two days of travel, to be greeted by the people singing and dancing. They sat us down and carefully washed our feet with soap and water and dried them. I was overwhelmed with emotion at their love and

welcome, I couldn't help tears running down my face. I was reminded of Jesus washing his followers feet at his last supper.

The purpose of the Conference was to establish a Christian Discipleship team (learning how to follow Jesus). The team was led by Tim Wambunya, former bishop of the Diocese of Butere in Kenya. Bishop Tim now leads the multi-cultural church of St Paul's,

Slough. The conference was opened by the Hon. James Zan Chol, Deputy Maiwut County Commissioner.

One hundred and five people attended the conference, including about ten from other denominations. They were clergy, evangelists, mothers' union members with their babies, and youth. All one hundred and five received certificates and books. We also had about two thousand people attend the Sunday service. This included the government Deputy Commissioner and some denominational leaders.

One month later John Jamuth (pictured here) was able to report that he had been




visiting group leaders in their own villages. He writes: "It was a blessing for me as they accepted Rooted in Jesus discipleship training in Maiwut centre, bomas (enclosures) and villages." John has now told us that seventy-five groups have completed the first book and are moving on to the second book.

With technical help from David Bartlett I was able to take five micro Water Filters, enough to provide clean water purified from bacteria for ten to fifteen families for up to ten years. I am also very grateful for support towards my costs by a grant from a St Albans diocesan charity, the Verulam House Fund Trust.

It would be lovely to continue to support the work in Maiwut. "We have achieved very little," John explained, "because we have no resources, and war and floods have greatly affected the community. The bishop and clergy have no salary or other means of support. We request the Rooted in Jesus team to return to Maiwut, we felt your wisdom, love and discipleship will change our community."

That is my prayer too - I feel forever changed by the witness of their faith, their courage and total trust in God in the face of hardship and poverty. I sat by a church Treasurer while he was eating lunch one day. He was eating just a bowl of white rice. I noticed he was pouring hot water into the bottom of the bowl, and mixing it with a bit of the rice to enjoy each spoonful with what became a little 'rice flavoured' water. The Conference ran out of money for food after three days, so the team took turns to give \$45 a day so people could eat and not have to return home. They used this to make a nourishing dried Nile Fish stew to go with rice and vegetables.

I couldn't help but notice a priest - she had chopped off the side of her finger. She had covered her injured finger in plastic. The wound was weeping and she was pestered by flies. This could have developed into serious illness. Thankfully I was able to clean the wound and dress it with a plaster and we gave her antibiotics (something we would take for granted here). The next morning, she arrived radiant and smiling after a night free of pain. I have since learned she is doing well.



I made friends with Archdeacon Jacob (photo left) and his wife Nyjany. Jacob is a WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene) Officer, and Nyajany is a Nurse - both working across the border in neighbouring Ethiopia, with noone to employ them in their South Sudan home village. We were able to leave the Water Filters for Jacob to distribute and all our First Aid and Medicines with Nyajany. I've since been able to pass on £380 given by people to Nyajany for her to buy more First Aid and Medicines to give simple treatments to children and families in the villages. The Mothers Union made a request to us for Tools for farming which we have not yet provided. Nyajany is pictured below at the front of the group, teaching.

I'm left in awe at the people's resilience and faith and I'd love to support them as they carry the life-changing message of Jesus to their communities and care for the elderly, children and families.



In church, we had our annual meeting last month (APCM), and as Rector it is a time for me to say a huge thank you to all who have contributed to the life of St Mary's over the past year: our Reader Keith Callard, Ruth Callard (our pastoral visitor who also runs Rectory Teas), the Church Wardens - Chris Valentine and Pete Clark, our PCC, our Sacristans, our Lay Leaders of Worship, our caterers, churchyard working party-ers, our organists, sides persons, readers and pray-ers and rota-makers, CD Play-ers, cleaners, launderers, flower arrangers, bell ringers, maintenance team, and of course James and Miriam Read and our 2nd Sunday Strollers!... And I apologise if I have missed any one! Thank you to all who contribute their gifts generously, quietly, tirelessly.

They sound a crowd don't they? But actually we all know that they number only few people...

I think I should add that, as there are many people who kindly wear "several hats" and undertake two or three (or more!) jobs in and around the Church, and others who have served faithfully for many many years, there is often actually a shortage of helpers. We are always grateful when new people offer to contribute their gifts - please do get in touch with me if you feel this could be you!

I am pleased also, to thank the Friend's of St Mary's for their generosity in raising funds for the Church - and for the fun and fellowship their events generate in the Church and the Village (the Village Quiz is coming up on 1st July!) In June this year, the church linens are turned to green and we enter what the church calls Ordinary Time or Numbered Weeks. For most of the year now, until Advent - we will be studying week by week, the ministry of Jesus as recorded in the Gospel of Matthew. Perhaps our prayer through this time might be the prayer I think many of us do pray, based on the prayer of Richard, Bishop of Chichester (1197-1253):

"O most merciful redeemer, friend and brother, may we see you more clearly, love you more dearly and follow you more nearly, day by day."





How (Not) To Become A Famous Author by Patrick O'Connor

One day many years ago, I was sitting out on the patio, writing a letter. The sky was blue and gentle cumulus clouds were scudding by. I began to imagine that I was actually sailing over a sparkling ocean. I kept writing along this imagined course, and gradually a story developed.

My solo sailor was on a small yacht in mid Atlantic, having survived a hurricane. Walter was there because, after a bizarre failed suicide attempt, he had been admitted to a mental institution. There it was decided that the only therapy that could heal his condition was to be made to sail solo around the world. So here he was, relieved, but alone. From astern, a sweet voice was calling "Luff up! Wait for me."

Our hero swung his craft about, a lovely young lady swam alongside and he helped her aboard. She was feminine perfection, but Walter discovers that she is also weirdly unnatural. In a series of wild adventures they cross oceans, make exotic landfalls and survive terrifying dangers. They encounter more people, good, evil and mad. Throughout their odyssey Walter faces tantalising prospects of submission and erotic rapture. He wrestles with the emotional conflicts that arise. Walter's therapy sails to a surprising finale, a counterpoint of tragedy and joyful triumph.

I eventually completed this masterpiece, and the next obvious step was to have it published. I anticipated immediate enthusiastic responses, sales of millions and a blockbuster film. How could such an amazing story fail to succeed like this?

However, as I was about to discover, creating a masterpiece is the easy part. You cannot approach a book publisher directly. You have to do is this through a literary agency. There are many of these, and they all receive hundreds of hopeful submissions every year. Modern publishers are only interested in a high probability of business success for any titles they publish. So the literary agencies comply with this business approach. This means that new and unknown authors stand very little chance of having a manuscript accepted by an agency. Authors who have become famous, including Patrick O'Brian, J. K. Rowling and others suffered many rejections on their way to fame. So I was rejected over and over until I had offered my masterpiece to every agency in London. Fame and fortune no longer beckoned. Then I discovered the new way to be published: Internet publishing. All one needs to do is to prepare a manuscript and upload it to an Internet publisher. They will print and ship individual copies to order. So there is no need for the author to buy copies and try to sell them, and the author retains the copyright. The whole process is quite simple for anyone with reasonable computer skills. And best of all, the cost is zero. You set the price, and the publisher takes a percentage of each sale. The publisher I use is Amazon.com.

The only downside is that there is no marketing of your book. So "Walter Minion's Therapy" is published, but the world knows nothing of it. It's sales make no impact on my financial situation, and you will not have heard of me. But maybe one day...?

So, if you would like to become a famous author, I advise that you do not write a masterpiece. Instead, write something like Shades of Grey. Then it helps if you have a celebrity friend to recommend it, because people want to do what celebrities do. There is no sex in "Walter Minion's Therapy", and I have no celebrity friends, so I remain unknown, but content.







Equity release on the rise again

An increasing number of older homeowners are choosing to release equity, latest figures reveal, with cost-of-living pressures still the main reason for tapping into the value of their home.

On the rise

Equity release allows over-55s to access some of the value of their home as tax-free cash. In total, homeowners used equity release to borrow £6.2bn in 2022, a 29% yearly rise. Wake up and Smell the Roses! by Donna Cameron

Wow! You can almost see the garden growing... Every time I pop out into my garden something seems to have suddenly emerged or has burst open - none more so than the Roses. June is the height of the English Rose season.

I have over 20 different roses in my garden; another one of my plant addictions! I buy them because of their interesting names. Obviously I have 'The Generous Gardener' and 'Gertrude Jekyll' (one of my heroes - a garden designer) and 'Queen Elizabeth.' All these happen to be pink which is also my favourite colour.

A fantastic climbing rose I saw on holiday in Norfolk, aptly called 'Mermaid', is a large, open, bright yellow rose that flowers throughout summer. I have two of these climbing the willow fences. I have been putting it in my latest designs as it's just so jolly.

I also have 'Pride and Prejudice' and 'Hot Chocolate' and 'Joie de Vivre'.

An interesting old-fashioned one that my teacher always said everyone should have in their garden is Rosa Mundi, dating to 1580. It is fascinating. The petals are two-tone, light pink and cerise. They last well in a vase with some sprigs of Alchemilla Mollis.

Roses go back much further. Fossil evidence has shown they date back 35 million years. They were much sought after by the Egyptians and Romans for their rose petals and perfumes and have featured throughout history with their connection to love.

Of course the Tudor Rose has been an emblem of England for hundreds of years and still features on the back of 20p and the Royal coat of Arms.

There is a rose for every situation. Be it climbing, rambling, patio or shrub.

They have dipped in and out of fashion over the years. Back in the 1950s they were considered old fashioned in their sterile rose beds. But they dont have to be grown that way. Put them in a mixed herbaceous border. Good companion plants are Lavender, Nepeta and Alliums. Gorgeous! ...and you can't beat the scent.

They are very low maintenance and robust. Just prune them in Feb, feed them twice a year once in April and once after first flush of flowers in summer with rose food and a mulch of well-rotted manure. Keep dead-heading and you will be well rewarded for years to come. Enjoy!

Cineaste's Corner by Dave Peters: Ed Wood

I recently rewatched the excellent Tim Burton directed "Ed Wood" (1994) which has long been my favourite Burton film. Edward D. Wood Jr. has the distinction of being regularly voted the worst film director of all time. However, as he was totally unaware of his singular lack of talent, he went on to write, direct and produce several wonderfully bad films all of which were made on shoestring budgets. His most famous production, the truly awful "Plan 9 From Outer Space" (1957) is often cited as the worst film ever made and is therefore an absolute must watch cult classic.

Although primarily a biopic about Ed Wood this film is also Burton's homage to 1950's exploitation B-movies, and is beautifully shot in black and white to create a 1950's vibe. The film stars Johnny Depp who portrays Wood as a hopelessly optimistic, endlessly enthusiastic weirdo with a bottomless self-belief in his own genius. He is supported by an outstanding cast including Burton regulars Sarah Jessica Parker and Bill Murray.

Wood's unique approach to movie making is brought brilliantly and comically to life, for instance his extensive use of stock studio footage that often bore no relevance to the film at hand; his terrible dialogue; his insistence that the first take was always the best and reshoots were unnecessary, and his willingness to cast virtually anyone he met who was willing to appear in front of his camera whether or not they had ever acted before.


The other standout performance is Martin Landau's portrayal of Bela Lugosi, for which he deservedly won the Best Supporting Actor Oscar in 1995. Lugosi was a 74-year-old impoverished morphine addict when he met Wood, he was resentful of his lost fame as a horror movie icon, and particularly disparaging of the still popular Boris Karloff who he saw as his greatest rival. Wood, already a huge fan of Lugosi, unexpectedly bumps into him in an undertaker's where Lugosi is testing out coffins because he's "tired of life". Wood immediately casts Lugosi in his next production, the totally wacky "Glen or Glenda" (1953) a film about transvestism in which Wood - who was himself an enthusiastic transvestite - is directing himself in the Glen/Glenda role.

Burton focuses the rest of the film on the making of "Bride of the Monster" (1955), Lugosi's last full movie for Wood, and of course the infamous "Plan 9 From Outer Space". Burton recreates the scene where Lugosi filmed a test for Plan 9 which was shot with him just standing outside of his own front door, shortly after which he inconveniently died. Unperturbed by the loss of his star, Wood still uses this test footage for the film (so he can put legitimately put Lugosi's name on the promotional posters) and hires his girlfriend's chiropractor, a man who looks nothing like Lugosi, to understudy him in the rest of the production. This necessitates the understudy shooting each scene with a cape covering his face to hide the fact that he isn't actually Bela Lugosi.

I also have to give an honourable mention to Vincent D'Onofrio who brilliantly portrays Orson Wells in a fictionalised scene set in a bar. When approached by a star-struck Wood (who is attired in an angora jumper, tight skirt, stockings, heels, and a beret), he offers him some sage directing advice.

It would have been very easy for Burton to make a film that only set out to mock Ed Wood's towering lack of talent, but thankfully he also celebrates Wood's optimism, enthusiasm, sheer love of film-making, and never-ending self-belief. The other frankly bizarre characters who appear did in fact inhabit Ed Wood's real world and also appeared in his films, and many of the events portrayed are firmly based in fact. However, I am also sure that there is much here that is a product of Burton's rich imagination. I really love this film and can't recommend it highly enough, and if you're interested in watching it yourself then it's available to stream on Disney+.


