Editorial by James Read

Last month we went to great lengths to publicise the Annual General Meetings of two important village institutions — Meppershall Village Hall, and this very publication! Only through strong community participation can these and many other things be guided and shaped by what people in the village want. At



the time of writing, the Messenger AGM hasn't happened... but we can tell you much more about the Meppershall Village Hall AGM...

There was a strong turnout on 13th June with some 50 people (estimated) coming to the village hall AGM to represent views from across the village. Feelings were running high. It is a credit to the Trustees that they engaged in a challenging discussion with many passionate views and comments from members of the community. All those who attended (Trustees and public) ensured that a robust and frank discussion took place. There was even a new volunteer offering to become an additional Trustee. Formal minutes will follow, here are my personal impressions.

At the heart of the challenges facing the village hall is its success in becoming self-sufficient since the new hall opened in 2018. The principle of self-sufficiency, the Trustees explained, had underpinned its finances right from the outset more than 10 years ago when plans to create the new building and facilities first began. Many voices down the years warned that a new hall with bigger bills to pay could become a burden. Those voices should now be well pleased with the way the Trustees have balanced the books; it is certainly an achievement. But self-sufficiency comes at a price.

The commercial hiring rates required to use the hall, and the number of bookings made by individual organisations, drive everything. Unfortunately this has led to inevitable trade-offs between different organisations seeking to hire the facilities. Local clubs and activities with low income and making less frequent bookings, have found themselves competing with higher incoming organisations seeking to book the hall for more extensive periods and/or at greater frequency. Some local organisations have lost out. In this issue, The Meppershall Players announce their new name to reflect their new venue – they were an early casualty. Other groups, more recently affected, were some of the loudest and most upset voices at the village hall AGM.

What can be done? Comments at the AGM showed significant public interest in some community funding for the hall, maybe via the Parish Council precept in our council tax. Maybe more fundraising is needed - charitable income to meet some of the costs. Of course private bookings at commercial rates must continue for a significant portion of the hall's timetable. But with a more diverse base of income, the village hall Trustees could adopt a policy of strong prioritisation of local organisations at certain times, with more discretion over the level of income achieved from such organisations (those who can reasonably demonstrate that they are based in, or formed from, our local community). But was does "local" mean? It means, like the area served by our village council and our church, the Parish of Meppershall.



Poems from Lockdown 2020-2021: Update and Display in Shefford Library

Some months ago I wrote about this poetry anthology, which I put together during the 2020 and 2021 lockdowns. The idea was to publish in book-form a collection of poems and illustrations by local writers and artists, and to sell it to raise some funds to be donated to two charities supporting people affected by the Covid lockdowns. Seventeen writers and illustrators, all living in Bedfordshire or North Hertfordshire, contributed 50 poems and 9 original illustrations. I edited and formatted all the material myself, and then the book was produced by a printer in Westoning in November 2021.

Since then I have been selling copies, usually at £8 each, from which £5 per book will go to the chosen charities, which are the young people's mental health charity, Young Minds, and the musicians' charity: helpmusicians.org.uk/coronavirushardshipfund.

I am pleased to say that I have now sold 181 copies which raises £970 for the charities.

I am also very pleased that **Shefford Library** are going to display the book in the Local Studies section, from 1 July for approximately 2 weeks.

I have a few remaining copies of the anthology still for sale, and would be delighted if a few people in the village would like to buy them.





Raffle – no Summer Fair would be complete without a chance to win something. We have some fantastic prizes lined up and we'd love to see you take them home


Classic Cars – we are so excited that we will be able to host a raft of classic cars from the village and beyond. A big thank you to Jean Holden for organising



The children moving up to school in September have been working hard on their leavers' show, which is always a highlight for staff and parents to see. Unfortunately this year, it is only available for the friends and family of those children taking part.

We know some parents may be thinking forward to the summer holidays and contemplating how to entertain their children during this time. Any parents who may be interested in being part of pre-school committee, please let any staff member know and we'll be able to give you more information. Our AGM is held annually in October.



Support For Local Families: Household Support Fund

Central Bedfordshire Council has been allocated £2.9 million of Government funding to support households in Central Bedfordshire with food, energy and water bills, and other wider essentials over the next year. The Household Support Fund is funded by the Department for Work and Pensions, and this is the fourth round of funding that the Council has received. It will run until March 2024.

Some of the funding has already been distributed to households. Supermarket vouchers have been provided to every child eligible for free school meals, with a £35 voucher over Easter, and a £17.50 voucher in May half-term. In total 15,104 supermarket vouchers (worth £396,533) were distributed. Support continues in the summer holidays, October half term, Christmas holidays and February 2024 half term.

As well as children entitled to free school meals, those eligible for support include:

- Children eligible for 2-year-old funding/Early Years Pupil Premium
- Care leavers (young adults aged between 18 and 25 years old that have previously spent time in care before they were 18 years old)
- Claimants of Housing Benefit and/or Council Tax Support including pensioners, disabled people and households with children
- Households with an annual income of less than £30,000 living in a permanent, residential park home or on a council-managed caravan site

Anyone who is eligible for support will be contacted by the Council, but the full list of who is eligible for support and how to apply for a grant is available on the Council's website: www.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/HSG

The Department for Education fund the programme and, linked to this, the Council's Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme will run through the summer with free, fun activities for children who receive benefits-based free school meals (reception through to year 11). All children attending get healthy snacks and lunch. Sessions are inclusive so are suitable for children with special education needs and disabilities.

Funding has also been provided to Disability Resource Centre, Advice Central, Citizens Advice (Dunstable, Mid-Bedfordshire, Leighton-Linslade), Bedfordshire Rural Communities Charity – Good Neighbour Scheme, Age UK, The NEED Project, PREEN Foodbank, Dunstable Foodbank, Carers in Bedfordshire and several lunch clubs.

Meppershall Parish Council – Approved Minutes

A Statutory Meeting of Meppershall Parish Council (MPC) took place on Monday 15th May 2023.

Election of Chairman - Resolved to elect Councillor Thompson as Chairman for the year 2023-2024.

Election of Vice-Chairman - Resolved to elect Councillor Parsons as Vice-Chairman for the year 2023-2024.

Chairman's announcements

• Attended the CPRE AGM on 26th April and will circulate the presentation given to councillors. CPRE is an organisation that supports MPC with advice and knowledge especially on matters concerning planning and the environment.

- The crime statistics for Meppershall in April show 10 reported incidents including several attempted break ins.
- Reminder given to all councillors to complete their Register of Interests on the CBC website (link provided by the Clerk) and to ensure that the Expenses forms are completed and sent to the CBC Electoral team.
- CBC Ward Councillor elections returned 27 Independents, 20 Conservatives, 10
 Liberal Democrats, 5 Labour, and 1 Green Party members. No party has an
 overall majority however the Independents will be asked to form an
 administration. The next CBC Full Council meeting will be on 25th May.
- Congratulations were offered to Ward Councillor Blake Stephenson who has been elected as ward councillor for the Meppershall, Shillington and Gravenhurst Ward.
- Beds PCC has reported that Beds Police numbers have increased by nearly 200.
- The Clerk has advised that the 100 High Street planning appeal hearing will be held on 27th and 28th June.

Public Session - CBC Ward Councillor Stephenson provided an update on Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) activities:

- Thanks were offered to all for his election as Ward Councillor.
- CBC Election Results As explained by the Chairman the Independents will be given the first opportunity to form an administration and to appoint both portfolio holders and committee positions. Due to no party having an overall majority the dynamics at CBC will change for both CBC officers and elected councillors. The full council meeting on 25th May will be the key to the future four years.
- Current Focus Former Meppershall Ward Councillors Brown and Liddiard have not disappeared and are working with Councillor Stephenson in the background. A list of 'issues' to deal with has been provided to Councillor Stephenson to deal with and this includes the Vehicle Activated Sign installation on Shefford Road. It is also hoped that there can be a greater working relationship between the villages in the Ward (Meppershall, Shillington and Gravenhurst).
- Tidy Tips A programme of maintenance at CBC owned Tidy Tips is planned over the summer with each Tidy Tip closed at different times.
- Community Asset Grants Bidding to start soon.

Questions / comments from the public:

- There are giant hogweed infestations visible on roadsides, what is CBC's policy regarding removal? *Cllr Stephenson to investigate and advise the Clerk*.
- Why was MPC not consulted on the permanent location of Meppershall Academy Year 5 and Year 6 children on the Henlow Academy site in Henlow? Cllr Stephenson to investigate and advise the Clerk.

Co-option - The Clerk advised that there were currently two vacant councillors' seats, and that two expressions of interests in co-option forms had been received and circulated to councillors with meeting papers. The two individuals interested in co-option, Mr Philip Russell, and Mrs Roma Avrili were both present at the meeting. Resolved to co-opt Mr Philip Russell and Mrs Roma Avrili as Councillors to Meppershall Parish Council

- **c.** Invitations Attendance at Area 5 Community Policing Parishes Working Together Meeting Tuesday 20th June 11am. Clerk to attend with Councillors Seaman and Thompson attending the Area 5 Priorities setting meeting on 20th June.
- **d. IT and Communications** A report on website usage was circulated to councillors at the beginning of the month. Councillor Standbridge reported that there had been 828 website views in April and that email accounts of retiring councillors have been restricted.

OPCC and RMF grant funding and works update including dispute raised with **CBC regarding invoice received for part of the works -** The Clerk advised that CBC contractors had installed the VAS on Shefford Road on 11th May however they had not removed the bend right sign in front of it, so the VAS is obscured (pictures forwarded to MPC and CBC). This issue was raised with CBC by the Clerk immediately as it was obvious that this would be an issue of ridicule raised by our residents – Facebook posts were seen about it on Friday evening. CBC have advised that they will resolve the issue ASAP. The Clerk has also received a 7-day notice for payment as per the invoice previously received from CBC. As works are not yet completed and details pending from CBC on invoicing cost, the Clerk has advised CBC that the invoice is in dispute pending their response. The Clerk confirmed that she has never received quotations from CBC for the works, despite requesting them, and had never issued a purchase order for the works. Resolved that the Clerk does not make payment of the CBC Highways invoice as issues and that the Clerk and Chairman seek to resolve the matter with the CBC Highways team.
- **b.** Update on road safety improvements on new developments Councillor Seaman is awaiting an update from Davidsons
- c. Update of Fix My Street reports Councillor Seaman is making between 2 to 5 submissions every on Fix My Street. It has taken more than 4 weeks to fix signage and 3 separate reports on fix My Street to get the Shillington Road VAS working.

Environment and Leisure

a. Update on maintenance works - The Clerk has previously issued a purchase order for the installation of fencing at the far end of the copse on Centenary

Field and another for the installation of the replacement gate and bollard at Old Road Meadow, notice boards and reinstallation of the bollard on the Crackle Hill driveway. Some works have been completed but others are pending. *Clerk to chase.*

In An English Country Garden by Donna Cameron



A Tribute To Christine Foster 1953-2023



Trying to describe someone you have known intimately for 54 years is like trying to explain a striking sunset or a Rembrandt painting to someone shut away in a darkened room. Words are not enough! But I want to try to honour the life of Christine, as best I can: my lovely wife, who died on May 7th after a diagnosis of terminal and inoperable glioblastoma brain cancer this time last year.

One way to describe her would be by timeline. Christine was born in 1953, the eldest of 4 children. Her father was a Headteacher (Headmaster back then?) which meant a somewhat nomadic, though happy, upbringing. Our paths crossed in 1968 when her father was Headteacher at Clifton Primary School. After school Christine also trained as a primary age teacher, teaching for three years, initially in Barton and then Meppershall. Subsequently she chose to be a full-time mother and farmer's wife. After 7 years living at Fowlers Farm, where our two sons were born, we moved to Polehanger to concentrate on running the farm business together. She was active in the village W.I., the Methodist Sunday School in the 1970s and Shefford Baptist Church

in the 1980s. In the 90s and 00s she had more time to devote to projects linked to charities we were associated with. We lived at Polehanger for 41 years before retiring into a newly built house in Fowlers Drive in July 2022, coming full circle geographically speaking. It was at this point that Christine's brain tumour was diagnosed.

Another way to describe her would be by achievement, though she wouldn't have been particularly comfortable with that. Christine was clearly an able teacher though she didn't practise in the classroom for that long. However the skills and attitude that informed her teaching were evident throughout her life. She was gifted with outstanding organisational and administrative skills. These were put to good use in many and various ways: from keeping the family fully functioning; through planning and organising events, some small like the church tea tent at the village fete, some large like setting up a food shop at the Stoneleigh Bible Week camps over 2 weeks catering for 10,000 people attending each week; to running the farm business; to overseeing the design and construction of our retirement home alongside our architect. These just to name a few. Not only was she very good at problem solving but she often foresaw a potential problem, heading it off before it became one. In all these different situations she showed patience and graciousness. Most people, however, would experience those skills through her hospitality at home. Mealtimes with extended family or groups of friends never seemed to faze her.

To my mind though, the best way to describe someone is in relational terms and the qualities of character and personality that are brought into those relationships. Christine was a wife, mother, grandmother, sister, friend and much more. To each of these relationships she brought focussed and individualised compassionate kindness, firm grace and imaginative generosity. We have received so many cards since Christine died that have expanded on this in particular ways relevant to the writer. Yet it has been a great comfort and encouragement to me that there are these consistent and common themes. How she would drop round to see people needing support, often armed with home-made cake, how she drove friends to appointments when she could have argued that it wasn't convenient, how she listened with commitment to those in need, how she gave of herself because she cared. These qualities were informed and generated through her deep, quiet Christian faith in a God who she knew was with her. She wanted to be infectiously more like Christ. In that way, in her small way, the world was, is and will be, a better place. She leaves us with long living memories.

Thanks to Chris Foster for this moving and beautiful tribute to Christine who is dearly missed by so many in the village following the sad news in May. Sympathies and condolences to you, Chris, and the whole family. How lucky we are to have had this wonderful lady at the heart of village life for so many years.

How (Not) To Become A Cocaine Smuggler by Patrick O'Connor

My wife and I, with our five young sons, flew to Trinidad for a family holiday. The flight was a charter, full of eager travellers, and the duty free flowed. We made friends with a young man who sat next to us. He was scheduled to return with us, so we wished him a happy time on the island.

Sure enough, our friend was on the return flight. But he was a different person, not the amiable chap we remembered, and he kept a distance from us. One arm was encased in plaster cast: he said he had fallen from a balcony. The next morning, back in England, we wished him well, and invited him to visit if he was up our way. I gave him my card. We went our separate ways.

Several months later, one dark evening, the doorbell rang. I answered and was faced by a serious-looking man. Standing behind him were several policemen. "Are you Mr. O'Connor?" He asked. I admitted to this, and he responded "I have a warrant to search your property. I must warn you that my men are all armed". I did not resist, but let them in. My wife and boys were duly very surprised.

The first interrogation was to ask if we had a Timothy Heap in the house. We denied this, said we had never heard of anyone by that name. They were not convinced by this and proceeded to search the house. My wife and I were separated, she taken for further questioning, and I to accompany the search party. The boys were enjoying all this and tagged along with me. The police searched every room. To get into the attic the bravest one had to remove his bullet-proof vest and gun belt to fit through the hatch, and the boys were keen to help. But there was no sign of Mr. Heap.

The search moved outside. At the back door the leader grabbed one of the boys who was about to run out and pulled him back. He spoke into his microphone. "We are coming out. Mr. O'Connor is leading." When I stepped out I saw that there was an armed policeman at each corner of the garden. The search of the garage and greenhouse was also fruitless.

Back inside, the atmosphere became more relaxed as they accepted our puzzled protestations and as there had been no shootout. They explained that they had been acting under orders from Scotland Yard, and that I should call them if I wanted to find out why. We bade them good night and resumed our evening.

The next day I called Scotland Yard. They explained that, based on information about cocaine smuggling, they had raided Timothy Heap's London apartment. He had skipped the net, but they found guns. And my card. There was more information in the papers, he added. I found a paper, and there was a photo of our travelling companion.

I called my wife. "You remember Tim", I said. His plaster cast must have been filled with cocaine. We have not seen him since.

So, to avoid becoming part of a drug smuggling ring, be careful about the friends you make when travelling.



Over 50 and re-joining the workforce? Remember your pension

Cineaste's Corner by Dave Peters: Portrait Of A Lady On Fire

Written and directed by the French auteur Céline Sciamma, "Portrait Of A Lady On Fire" (2020) tells the story of a passionate romance between two women set on a remote island off the coast of 18th Century Brittany. Héloïse (Adèle Haenel) is the daughter of a widowed Italian countess (Valeria Golino). Having been previously living in a convent she has been obliged to return home because she is expected to replace her deceased sister as the prospective bride of a Milanese nobleman (it is later

revealed that Héloïse's sister threw herself off a cliff and committed suicide). In order to secure the marriage of her daughter the countess needs her to sit for a portrait, which will then be sent to her prospective husband in Milan, and without which there can be no marriage. However, Héloïse has refused the match and therefore will not sit for the portrait, which has resulted in one artist having already been dismissed for his failure to produce the desired picture.

It is a full 20 minutes before Héloïse is seen and even then, only from the back as she leaves the house to go for a walk. She is closely followed by Marianne (Noémie Merlant), an artist who has been engaged by the countess ostensibly as a walking companion to keep Héloïse company. However, the real reason she has been engaged is to secretly paint a portrait of the prospective bride by studying her on their walks during the day and then covertly painting her portrait. Almost immediately Marianne, who has been following Héloïse across the lawn expecting to go for a gentle stroll, is terrified to see her suddenly running full tilt towards the cliff edge, however she turns back at the last second and we finally see her face when she expresses her delight at having finally had the opportunity to run.

After some time observing and secretly painting the portrait, Marianne finally confesses the real reason she has been hired by the countess and Héloïse is naturally upset by the revelation. Despite this setback the two women become closer and their desire for each other increases until neither can resist it any longer. After finally completing the 'secret' portrait Marianne shows it to Heloise who is totally unimpressed by it, dismissing it as lifeless. Distressed by this Marianne destroys the picture much to the dismay of the countess. However, as the relationship between both women has become increasingly intense and intimate, Héloïse surprises her mother by agreeing to willingly pose for another portrait, thereby ensuing Marianne remains with her on the island.

While the countess is away on business for five days the three main characters, Marianne, Héloïse and the maid Sophie (Luàna Bajrami) are left alone in the house. The women quickly bond with each other playing card games, cooking, generally having fun, and engaging in some amusing 18th century methods to attempt to abort Sophie's unwanted pregnancy. Héloïse poses each day in an elegant green dress while Marianne paints her portrait, both women knowing that as each day brings the portrait closer to completion, it also brings them closer to the end of their affair.

This is a wonderful story about female relationships. Sciamma herself described it as "a manifesto about the female gaze", a contrast to the way in which women are normally portrayed in film under the 'male gaze'. This is given additional prominence by virtue of there being no male characters to be seen in any scene other than the boatmen who row Marianne to the island at the very start of the story, and a brief incidental character in the penultimate scene in an art gallery.

"Portrait Of A Lady On Fire" is a beautiful romantic film, an intense and moving love story between two women, with great cinematography and outstanding performances from all the leads. Winner of the Palm d'Or at the 2019 Cannes Film Festival this will surely be recognised as one of the great films of this century and a true work of art. "Portrait Of A lady On Fire" is available to stream on Netflix.


